George A. Callbeck, Manager Canadian National Silver Fox Breeders' Association returned by plane Saturday from Montreal. He was attending the Canadian Fur Auction Sales Company Silver Fox Auctions.

The following report is from Mr. Callbeck: There were 22,940 pelts catalogued and of these 70 per cent sold at an average of \$22.00. 198 selected halves and three-quarters silvers were 92 per cent sold at an average of \$21.11, a decline of 6 per cent from previous sale. 1,462 ordinary halves and three-quarters were 84 per cent sold at an average of \$23.64, 10,801 inferior silvers were 78 per cent sold at an average of \$18.75, price, unchanged. 1,808 low grades were 97 per cent sold at an average of \$20.10, a decline of 14 per cent. 134 special skins, white faces, ring necks and platinum silvers were 90 per cent sold at an average of \$66.90. Buyers were present or their representatives from South America, Mexico, New York and many Canadian cities.

Commenting on the lower average of \$22.00 for this sale as compared with \$23.90 for the January sale, Mr. Callbeck remarked that nearly 12,000 of inferior and low grades were bought back in January and placed on last week's sale. That left about 10,000 fresh skins so when this is taken into consideration there is really very little difference in average price and the feeling is that the market will continue strong as the available number of pelts is not large.

The Germans, in fact, broadcast unconfirmed claims that they had captured the important Russian rail centres of Loozova and Kramatorsk and claimed that "particularly high losses in men and material were inflicted on the enemy, who offered desperate resistance."

Listing the booty they allegedly captured from Feb. 20 to Feb. 26, the Germans claimed also that "more than 14,000 dead were counted on the battlefield" from the struggles at Loozova and Kramatorsk.

The Russian midday communique said artillery exchanges continued in the action west of Rostov and that big Russian guns had demolished "dozens of blockhouses and dug-outs."

As for the past week, the Russians made no mention of places captured. They declared that reconnaissance patrols west of Khar'kov had penetrated the German rear and exploded a large artillery dump.

Moscow dispatches said the Russians were penetrating deeper into Axis-held territory and repulsing mounting counter-attacks. The Soviet air around Orel, however, the German central and southern fronts north of Kursk, was reported by Pravda to be closing steadily.

Thawing weather is hampering the Russians, but Moscow dispatches said the Soviet general expected more frosts to facilitate their drive before the advent of spring.
