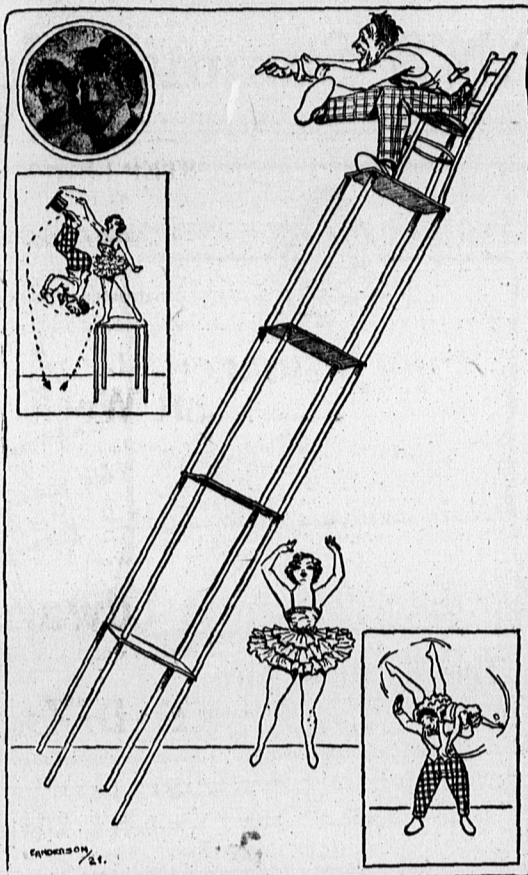

AUSTRALIA WELCOMES EMPIRE JOURNALIST

SYDNEY, Australia, Sept. 4.—The empire press delegates to the Imperial press conference at Melbourne arrived here after a somewhat stormy voyage from New Zealand. They were welcomed by Premier M. Bruce of the Australian commonwealth.

Bruce described the coming Imperial press conference as the unofficial parliament of the British Commonwealth of Nations. "The fuller knowledge resulting from the interchange of ideas," he said, "will enable the conference to make a valuable contribution to the solution of empire problems. The delegates have at their disposal command potent instruments for moulding and directing public opinion and have as an audience the whole people of the empire."

CHURCH UNITY

One of the Bishops of the Eastern Church who have lately been visiting England, in speaking of the reunion of the Anglican and Eastern Churches, said that it would come only when we had learned to worship together. He learned a wise saying, presenting both the problem of reunion and its solution in a very few words.

There are certain hopeful signs here in Canada of a better understanding between our Church and the other communions, and these are not the less hopeful because they are entirely spontaneous and unofficial. Consider, for instance, what has been happening this past year at Annapolis. The Churches in that home of history have quietly themselves. Community prayer-meetings have been held, on a strictly neutral ground where the people of the town have been learning to pray together in spite of their religious differences. On Sunday August the 16th a Community Sunset Service was held at Fort Anne when the rector of St. Luke's presided, and Dr. Clarence McKinnon, of Pine Hill, made an address. The singing of the hymns was led by the town band, and more than eight hundred people were present to worship. Of course the significance of a service of this sort should not be overstressed, but it is a sign of the times, and the movement at Annapolis is worth watching.

Then again, when the Cardinal Archbishop of Quebec died, and his body was being ceremonially borne from his palace to lie in state at the Basilica, the bells of the Anglican Cathedral tolled as the procession passed. A small thing, of course, but one that shows that Christian courtesy is growing stronger in our church, and underneath all our differences, there is a steadily deepening conviction of an underlying brotherhood in Christ.

The road to unity is long and toil some, but no one can look out upon Christendom today without

being convinced that we are all on the same way.
