Mr. Graham possessed many sterling qualities, he was upright and honest in character, kind and obliging in disposition, courteous and affable in his demeanour to all, and neighbourly in the extreme, oftentimes he has sacrificed personal comfort in order to relieve pain and attend on the sick. He was a member of the Presbyterian Church, and nothing afforded him greater pleasure, when in health than to attend Divine Service, rarely missing an opportunity of doing so when at all possible. The esteem in which he was held, was shown by the large number who attended his funeral and followed his remains to the Murray Harbor North Cemetery and saw them laid beside that of his wife Charlotte Clow who succeeded him in death one year and ten days. To many he often remarked that he had no great desire to live and was quite willing to resign a whenever it pleased God to remove him from the cares and toils of this earthly sphere. Of him it may be truly said, a good man has gone to his reward. He leaves to mourn three sons, Benj. J. (head of the firm of Graham & Cameron) and Gordon of East Boston, Albert E. on the old home ead, and three daughters, who were with him at his death, also five brothers, besides a large circle of friends and acquaintances.

HALIFAX MARKETS.

The produce markets continue to be fairly well supplied, although one or two lines are on the scarce side. These are eggs, poultry and some vegetables. Eggs are very scarce still, but owing probably to the approaching close of navigation, prices in Charlottetown are not quite so stiff as they have been. Auld's quote on Dec. 9th "fifty to one hundred cases fresh at 2 1/2 subject to being unsold on receipt of order. Lined 20 cents, F. O. B." Gunas and Hislop and Hunter, who flooded this market with eggs two years ago, quote higher than P. E. L. and they say stock is scarce. They are firm here at 23 cents and stocks are sufficient to carry over Christmas.

Butter is a little firmer. It has advanced one cent a pound in the past 2 weeks. The factories quote creamery at 24 cents. It is jobbing here at 23 and retailing at 30. Cheese is unchanged. Potatoes are about the same, receipts being fairly heavy and quotations if anything weaker, the prices from schooners being below 30 cents. Other vegetables are scarce at previous quotations. The pork market is a little firmer, supplies being not overly plentiful. Prices are fully one cent better than ten days ago. Light hogs are worth 12-12 now. Other quotations are rabbits 8 to 10c per pair; Cranberries, \$7.00 to \$7.50 per barrel. Turnips 14 to 15c. Chickens and fowl, 40 to 50 cents per pair, Geese, 75 to 90 cents ea h. All the above are jobbing prices.

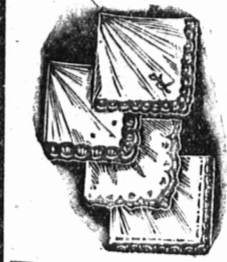
