GUARDING HER SECRETS.

BERLIN, May 27.—The Government has sent to the Reichstag a bill making the punishment more severe for the betrayal of military secrets. A new feature of the proposed legislation provides for penalties for the publication of news which ought to be kept secret in the interest of national defence.

REFORMATORY FOR MARITIME PROVINCES

OTTAWA, May 27—A bill was introduced by the Minister of Justice this morning to extend in Ontario the system of indeterminate sentences. The bill also provides for the building of a new joint reformatory for Nova Scotia and New Brunswick and gives Prince Edward Island authority to send culprits to it.

ONTARIO FARMER FOUND DEAD ON THE HIGHWAY.

ALVINGTON, Ont., May 27—William W. Gray, aged forty, a farmer living three miles south of here, was found dead on the roadway this morning with an overturned wagon across his chest. The accident probably happened last night, but was not discovered until this morning. He leaves a wife and five small children.
