ORDERED TO P. E. I.—The Boston American of Monday says:—Mary P. Jerome, the seventeen-year-old girl who a week ago attempted suicide in her room on Massachusetts avenue, was ordered to her home in Prince Edward Island today. She was banished from the country as an alien minor without visible means of support, and with a jail record. The order for the deportation was announced into Roxbury District Court, charged with the violation of the terms of a recent parole, which followed a conviction for drunkenness. The case against her was filed, and she departed in the custody of an immigration officer.

ISLAND BOY WITH VICTORY BONDS.—The following is copied from a Brandon, Manitoba, paper. "Once again Brandon has fulfilled its reputation of going over the top and has more than obtained its objective. Saturday night the third Victory Loan Campaign closed with a city \$1,377,200 ahead of its objective of \$750,000. This makes a grand total for Brandon of \$2,127,200. Brandon has not only won the Prince of Wales Victory Loan Flag, but will also receive seven crests, as a crest is obtained for every twenty-five per cent. over the allotment. Arrangements are being made to fly the flag in front of the City Hall today or on Tuesday. During the campaign the work of the two teams that canvassed the city was very close, and it was not until Saturday night that it was known just who the prizes of two \$100 bonds would go to. However, it was finally decided that Mr. Bruce Davidson was entitled to the award of a Hundred Dollar bond for turning in the most applications, while Mr. J. D. 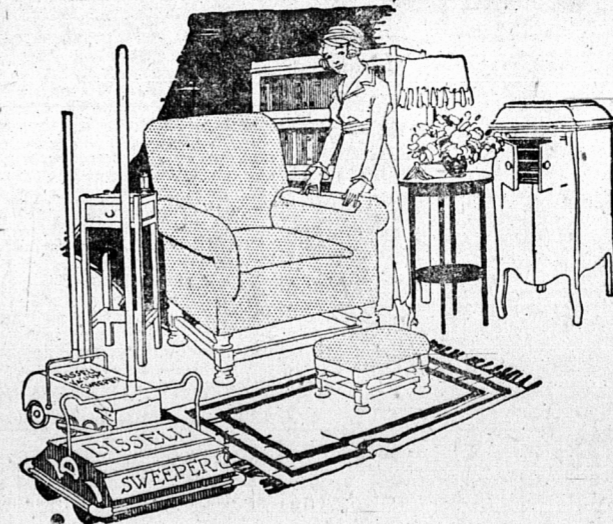

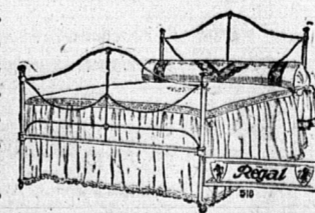
