He then entered Queen's University, leaving to accept a position in the Civil Service at Ottawa. In 1876 he entered upon the study of law. He received the nomination from the Conservative party in Cornwall and Stormont, in 1886, but retired in favor of the late Dr. Berger. He again received nomination in 1900 and was elected by a substantial majority.
