The death occurred at New Glasgow Road on October 31st of James Green at the advanced age of 86. The deceased immigrated from England when four years old. He is survived by two sons, James H., in British Columbia and J. W. on the homestead, three daughters, Mrs. Axworthy, New Hampshire, Mrs. Richard Moore, Cavendish and Mrs. Edward Ford, Portage.
Donald McQuarrie, Boushaw, offers for sale his beautiful farm, known as Mount Pleasant Farm, containing 82 acres, with crops, stock and implements. This farm is one of the best in this section of the Province and contains two hundred apple trees. The property is not sold by November 27th, it will be offered by public auction on that date. The Plant liner Evangeline returned to Halifax yesterday after having been taken to Boston for inspection by the company's officials. Mr. Chipman, the Halifax manager of this line, accompanied the ship and on his return yesterday told a Morning Chronicle reporter of the great reputation accorded the new liner at Boston. President Perry and the other officials of the company said that the ship far exceeds their happiest expectations regarding her. On last Friday the ship was thrown open from two to six o'clock, and a great many people inspected her. A large number of New England ticket agents from all parts of that portion of the country visited the ship. They informed Mr. Chipman that they firmly believed the Evangeline would be the means of greatly increasing the tourist business by the splendid facilities it afforded for travel to the Province. The general opinion expressed was that this new departure of the Plant Line Company as embodied in the Evangeline exceeds everyone's expectations. The Evangeline will remain here until the end of the month when she will sail for the south. Her circuit for the winter will be from Key West to Jamaica and to Colon, Panama. Today the Evangeline will be open for public inspection from two to six o'clock in the afternoon, and from eight to ten o'clock in the evening.—Halifax Exc. The Evangeline will ply between Boston and Charlottetown next summer.

Interest is growing locally in hockey and it is expected a meeting to be held here Tuesday evening will be largely attended. Promoters of last year's team have been working steadily to arouse interest. N. R. Norman, who arrived in Moncton from Charlottetown on Saturday, will likely attend the meeting. A Bridgetown correspondent writes that the farmers in this vicinity have finished digging their potatoes which proved to be a bumper crop, yielding about four hundred bushels to the acre, with but two exceptions Charles Clay, Jr., and Neil Miller whose potatoes blighted early yielding about two hundred bushels per acre. The starch factory in this place proved to be quite a boon to the farmers this season by taking about thirty thousand bushels of their supplies at a fairly remunerative price. This is a splendid section of this Island for farming, the results being next to fox ranching.
