Whether it be to deter ambitious and unscrupulous statesmen from proposing warlike measures, or in the day of need to hold back an invading army, that nation which has at hand a picked body of marksmen, well armed, will find itself in a position to hold at bay its enemies for a long time.

The present minister of militia has exerted himself manfully in this direction and now civilian rifle clubs in every Province, supplement the regular militia organizations for the training of marksmen.

An example of the work being carried out is afforded in this city. At Kensington Rifle range within ten minutes walk of the centre of the City, there is afforded every opportunity for the man with a rifle to develop into a good shot.

There are about 35,000 men enrolled in the various rifle clubs of this Dominion. These men form a strong line of defence, when danger threatens, because of their familiarity with the rifle.

There should be more men taking their part in the rifle competitions from time to time. The prizes and the enjoyment of participating in the Provincial Rifle Association matches are not confined to the active militia.
