RECIPROCIITY EXPECTED.

OTTAWA, March 22.—While no official statement is available on the tariff situation, the return of Mr. Fielding from his Conference with President Taft, has brought about a complete change of feeling. Last week a tariff war was regarded as a certainty, while now Reciprocity is expected.

TRADE WITH UNITED STATES.

OTTAWA, March 21.—Unrevised official returns compiled by the customs department show that in the months preceding Feb. 1, 1910, Canada exported to the United States goods to the value of \$94,643,542. During the same time Canada imported from the United States goods to the value of \$179,723,510. Of this amount \$94,437,064 worth came in under the general tariff, and \$84,880,95 worth was on the free list.

MANY KILLED IN ACCIDENT.

MARSHALLTON, Iowa, March 22.—More than forty-five persons were killed and almost as many more seriously injured in the wreck at Green Mountain, of two Rock Island trains. Several of the injured may die. A number of the dead are so horribly mangled that their identification may never be possible.

WAR IN THE GREAT WEST.

WINNIPEG, March 22.—A struggle between Canadian and American Transportation interests for the honor of carrying Canadian grain from the Great Lakes to the Atlantic seaboard has been inaugurated by the American Railways and a better rate war is promised, in which the advantage will be on the side of the exporter.

MINER KILLED.

FRANK, Alta., March 20.—Charles Gorman, a miner, was working in the hillside mine this afternoon when a large rock fell from the roof striking him on the body breaking both legs and bruising him terribly. He was carried out of the mine and placed in a conveyance which left for Frank hospital but he died before half the distance was covered. He was 37 years old, married and leaves four children, all boys.

ROGERS PASS VERDICT.

REVELSTOKE, March 20.—Owing to the fact that the first jury disagreed, a second inquest on the bodies of the men killed in the Rogers Pass avalanche was held today. A verdict of accidental death was brought in with a rider that the practice of workingmen at clearing away snowslides on stormy nights be discontinued.

BEAUTIFUL MONTREAL HOME.

MONTREAL, March 20.—Col Burland has secured a site for a magnificent mansion on Park avenue, paying \$100,000 for the property. The grounds will be laid out by a landscape architect.

C. P. R. MEN GET INCREASE.

TORONTO, March 21.—Commencing March 15, the wages of the C. P. R. freight handlers and checkers was increased by one cent an hour. The men put in eleven hours per day and there are about 250 men affected by the increase. Several of the senior checkers have had an increase to the extent of two and three dollars per month. "It means \$1,000 more to the company in salaries," said Assistant Superintendent Coalter.
