MINISTER RIBUKES LIBERAL NEWSPAPER

Winnipeg "Free Press" Handled Without Gloves by Hon. Mr. Rogers.

WINNIPEG, Sept. 30.—The chief Liberal organ in Western Canada, the "Free Press" of Winnipeg, has persistently attempted to injure the Hon. Robert Rogers, Minister of Public Works, by a campaign against him of insinuation and defamation. Powerless to make just criticism, it has descended to the lowest form of political warfare to injure a public man, whose success has been bitter to the "Free Press" and its minions. The latest outbreak in this Liberal organ was an implied accusation against the Minister of Public Works of being a party to a circular letter issued by Dr. Schaffner to his constituents on the navy question. The letter contained nothing but the truth, and this was such a strong criticism of the Liberal position on this question that the "Free Press" could neither answer the charges nor conceal its rage. It immediately accused Hon. Mr. Rogers of being a party to the distribution of this letter. Mr. Rogers at once gave the lie to the "Free Press."

"Sodom, it ever, have I witnessed," said he, "more brazen effrontery than that exhibited by the "Free Press," editorial of the 4th September, in which they couple my name.

"Let me say, in the first place, that this is the first I had ever seen or even heard of Dr. Schaffner's letter to his constituents. As to the implied challenge of the "Free Press," I'm in readiness to discuss what they call the Liberal course in matters relating to Canada's assistance in the common defense of the Empire. Let me make it clear that there is no Liberal course to discuss, for the simple reason that what was known as Liberal truths and Liberal principles were bargained and sold and replaced by the principles of Laurierism in Canada as far back as 1897-98. And no one should better understand this bargain and sale than the "Free Press" newspaper. Of course, if the "Free Press" is as anxious now as they pretend to discuss the principles of Laurierism in the matter of Canada's relations to the common defence of the Empire, I am quite ready. But they will not dare do this, for the simple reason that Laurierism has never lost an opportunity of opposing every move that has ever been made that was designed to bring together in closer bonds of union the Motherland and the Overseas Dominions."

The "Free Press" has neither accepted Mr. Rogers' challenge nor retracted its false statement. Unable to defend its course, the Liberal organ seeks refuge in contemptible silence.

Kitchener Wants Motor Ambulances, and Canadian Fund May Supply Them

LONDON, Oct. 1.—The fact that hospitals are not the only way of aiding wounded soldiers is the reminder given by Lord Kitchener, who points out the urgent need for properly-constructed and equipped motor ambulances for the quick transport of the wounded from the firing line. The American Women's War Relief Fund, originally started for a hospital, has been diverted to the purchase of such ambulances. As the vehicles could bear the imprint of the donor, the suggestion has been made by a leading Canadian woman over here that a portion of the Canadian Women's Fund, now being sent to the War Office, might profitably be utilized in this form.


The Canadian Military Hospital at Shorncliffe is being furnished with all possible haste, in the hope that it will be ready for opening by the end of the week, as the War Office has intimated that it will be able to send some wounded for treatment immediately the doors open. Before this is done, an official inspection by the War Office must be made, and approval of the arrangements given.


