(Canadian Press) CHICAGO, Feb. 23.—The United States faces a financial headache if business improves too much this year, in the opinion of Charles E. Mitchell, president of the National City Bank of New York. "It would be dangerous if this year turned out to be any more prosperous than 1925," Mitchell said, "it would mean inflation, the forerunner of deflation, which, in turn, means a headache."

What's In a Name?

TRIESTE, Feb. 23.—Children born in the territories, ceded by Austria to Italy after the Great War, must be given Italian names, the court of appeals here has ruled. The court maintained that residents of the war-won territories should "at this historical moment be proud of their Italian nationality," and declared that refusal to give an Italian born child an Italian name was an anti-national act.
