REAR END COLLISION OF TRAINS AT KINGSTON, ONT.

KINGSTON, Ont., Dec. 18 - (CP) Five freight trains were derailed, a caboose burned, and a heavy 6100-type locomotive left the tracks when two Canadian National Railway freight trains were involved in a rear end collision tonight, one mile west of the other station. The mainline collision did not interrupt traffic on the double-track Montreal-Toronto route, as trains were re-routed over sidings in the Kingston yard.

Funded Debt Hits Record in Canada

OTTAWA, Dec. 19 - Canada's funded debt, which includes the Dominion's basic financial position, increased during the war by \$11,900,000,000, it was shown today in a survey of the 1945 financial picture on the basis of six years of wartime financing.

From March 31, 1940, to Aug. 31, 1945, total funded debt soared from \$3,695,885,000 to \$14,900,000,000 and officials estimate that by next March 31 it will have reached nearly \$16,000,000,000. The survey also showed that throughout the war Finance Minister Mackenzie King was able to maintain budget commitments to pay half the cost of the war and civil expenditures from taxation and the remainder by borrowing from the
