THE MINING INDUSTRY OF CANADA.

The mining industry of Canada, as the report of the Geological survey shows, continues to maintain its importance, although the total output for 1902 totalled in value only \$64,970,732, as compared with \$66,712,708 for the preceding year. The falling off, the report states, is due not merely to the decrease in the Yukon output of gold of \$3,500,000, but also to the very considerable falling off in values of all the remaining metallic minerals other than nickel. But for the large growth of the coal and coke industry, helped by increases in many of the other non-metallic products, the decrease in the grand total on account of the metallic class would have amounted to nearly 10 per cent. The total production of the metallic products shows a falling off of over 15 per cent, as compared with the equivalent figures for 1901, whilst the non-metallic class shows an increase of over 20 per cent. in a similar comparison.
