

BILLINGS TO DRIVE UHLAN.

NEW YORK, August 7—K. C. Billings, owner of Lou Dillon, has gone to Cleveland to drive his trotter Uhlán, 2,021, at the opening of the grand circuit meeting there tomorrow, in an attempt to lower the world's trotting record to wagon without the aid of a wind shield. The record is 2.03½, made by Major Delmar in 1903.

Mr Billings recently drove Uhlán a mile to wagon in 2.02½, but the performance was made at an amateur meeting, and was not a technical record.

Uhlán trotted a mile to sulkey a few days ago in 2.00½, which is faster than any other horse has ever shown in public or private without a

wind shield. Mr Billings has arranged to bring the horse east after his Cleveland engagement, and is expected that he will start to beat the world's record to sulkey during the New York grand circuit meeting August 23-27, at the Empire city track at Yonkers.


