THE 1919 CO-OPERATIVE WOOL SALES ON P. E. ISLAND

The report of the Co-operative wool marketing on P. E. Island, presented at the annual meeting of the Sheep Breeders' Association, is a very satisfactory one from every standpoint. This is the fifth year in which co-operative sales have been carried on in this province. The quantity of wool collected annually has been as follows:

The above will indicate to what extent this movement has grown since the initial sale. It will be observed that the amount of wool collected in 1919 shows an increase of almost 11,000 lbs. over the preceding year and nearly 60,000 lbs. over the first sale.

The average price received by the grower who patronized co-operative marketing was 62.2 cents per lb. At the time wool was being received at the grading stations, the open market (though the dealers were paying 45 cents per pound. Later, the price jumped to 50 cents and at a still later date the price ranged around 55 cents.

One man who had sold some wool on the open market at the commencement of the season sold the remainder through the Association and gained almost \$60.00 on his clip over the amount he would have received had he sold all on the local market.
