—The marriage of Miss Lillie Noonan to D. J. McNeill, Summerside, referred to in Saturday's Guardian, took place on Sept. 26th not 25 as appeared.

—Heath Strong, for the past few years Summerside correspondent for the Patriot in Summerside has resigned his position which has been taken over by Mr. Jardine.

—The partridge season has opened and therefore the season for stories is now on. A good one is on the minds of two prominent professional men, a lawyer and a doctor belonging to Summerside, who spent Friday last in the woods hunting for partridge. They left home early in the morning and decided to hunt the woods in the vicinity of Lot. 16, where the doctor had discovered a number of birds a few days before.

The weather was not the ideal kind for the game, being misty. Entering the woods in different directions the hunt started but after an hour's tramp the doctor decided to quit, but when he reached the road his companion could not be found. After several hours wait the lawyer finally emerged from the woods, his clothes torn and wet besides several "nicks" scratches on his face and hands, received during his efforts to find a way out, he having got lost and was over three hours before he finally got on to the right track again. The sports returned to town about noon with about the usual luck of "amateur" sportsmen, except that the partridge who are still looking for the doctor who discovered them some days ago.

—Mayor Morrison, Summerside, met with a serious accident on Saturday evening last which will confine him to his home for some days. But the etiquette of the Bar demands that any man who applies for silk shall write and inform every member of his circuit who is of long standing—that is, who has been called to the Bar for a more extended period than himself—of the fact that he has applied. This intimation gives the senior an opportunity of considering whether he should himself apply, and by so doing maintain his right of seniority. The decision of the Lord Chancellor is final on the question. When he has decided to make a new batch of K.O.'s, the applicants who have been successful are informed of the fact, and the appointments are duly gazetted.

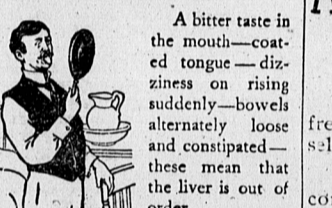
