MONTREAL MARRIAGE CASE.

MONTREAL, February 26.—That the Hebert and Tremblay wedding cases, involving the alleged right of the Quebec courts to give civil effect to decisions of the Roman Catholic church, dissolving marriages which had not been performed in accordance with its laws, will come up before the privy council in the near future, was the announcement made last night by George V. Cousineau, one of the lawyers who acted for the defence in opposing annulments in cases of this nature, in the course of an address on the status of married women, delivered in Emmanuel church, under the auspices of the Women's Council of Montreal.

The principal point in the Hebert case was whether the courts could uphold the ecclesiastical annulment of a marriage before a Protestant minister of two Catholics. Judge Laurendeau holding and the wedding could be decided the other way. An appeal against the latter judge's right to hear the case is pending.

S. S. AMELIA OFF ROUTE.

HALIFAX, Feb. 28.—Her contract for the service having nearly expired and it being deemed unprofitable to renew it, the Amelias Steamship Co., and which has been for the past four years on the shore route between Halifax and St. John, N.B., has now discontinued her sailings on the service and will tie up at Halifax for the rest of the winter. The ports at which the Amelia called on her route were Lunenburg, Liverpool, Lockeport, Shelburne, Yarmouth, Barrington, Clark's Harbour, Westport and St. John, also when freight offered, at Sandy Point. Until a short time ago Geo. C. Cook was the Halifax agent of the Amelia but since his departure for the West, Williams and Hartling have been managing this end of the service. It was the original intention of the company to run the Amelia on the route until the first of April but it is now understood that the scheme has been dropped. The annual inspection of the Amelia was held recently.
