## THE TRURO SHORT COURSE A SUCCESS

(Continued from page one). Former is unrepresented does not clearly appear; but the absence or scarcity from the fruit growing counties is accounted for in large measure owing to lesser resources that usual because of the small fruit crop of last season. For Nova Scotia, however, the registration is a record one.

The lecturers at this short course, in addition to the college staff, include Prof. Shutt, chemist at the Central Experimental Farm, Ottawa; A. MacNeil, chief of the Fruit Division at the Dept. of Agriculture, Ottawa; T. G. Raynor, representative and judge of the Seed Division, Ottawa; C. W. Macdougall, Dairy Superintendent, New Brunswick; R. Robertson, Manager Central Experimental Farm, Nappan, N. S.; Mr. Clark, Manager of the New Dominion Experimental Farm, Charlottetown; P. E. I.; R. J. Messenger, fruit farmer, and M. Johnston, fruit farmer, both of Bridgetown, N. S., who specialize in fruit growing; and W. Bishop, of Auburn, King's Co., who is the most extensive grower of cranberries in the East. It is noteworthy by the way, that Mr. Bishop gave the most interesting address on the subject of cranberry growing, and claims that this crop should be given more

extensive cultivation in the Maritime Provinces, there being many suitable places for the culture of the crop. As usual the central place of attraction at these short courses is in the arena or judging pavilion. Here live stock is brought and made the object of lessons. The college stock is this year better than ever and provides the most up-to-date examples of useful breeds. These are supplemented by animals of like breeding and quality from many farms in the neighborhood, of which excellent herds, which have improved almost a hundred per cent. within two years, exist, and attract attention to Truro and vicinity as perhaps the best live stock breeding district in the Maritime Provinces.

This short course will continue with three sessions a day until Friday next. On Tuesday the Eighth Annual Seed Fair will be held at the College, when thirty-five different varieties of seeds, including potatoes, will be judged and awarded prizes of merit. This competition may possibly determine an interesting contest between Colchester and Cumberland, for the Stanfield silver cup for the best seed potatoes. A.C. Walker, of Truro, has won the cup twice, and J. E. Harrison, Amherst, is tied with him. Whether one or the other is to win and become absolute owner of the cup will be decided this year, unless a new comer butts in and carries it away for a year or other indefinite period.

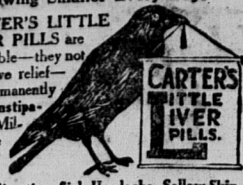

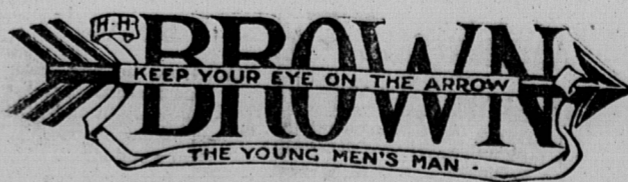
