 A HIGH COMPLIMENT.

In the recent case of Chappelle v. The King decided last month in the Judicial Committee of the Privy Council on appeal from the Supreme Court of Canada, the much disputed question as to the rights of placer miners in the Yukon Territory has at last been settled. The Supreme Court by a majority of three judges to two reversed the judgement of Barbridge J. in the Exchequer Court.

The final decision now is that placer miners have no absolute right to the renewal of their grants for five years but that on the contrary, the renewal is only an annual one, held in substitution for, but not in continuation of the original grant, without even an absolute right to such annual renewal; except as against interlopers.

This settled many disputed claims, opened the country for free mining, and prevents in large part the grasping avariciousness of the scheming prospector and promoter.

An Ottawa correspondent draws our attention to the exceedingly handsome compliment paid to Sir Louis Davies by the Lords of the Privy Council in their judgement. In it they say:

"The judgement of Davies J. appears to their Lordships to deal with the subject in a manner which leaves nothing to be desired. It is concise, clear, and convincing. Their Lordships are unable to add anything to it in the way of argument. They will therefore content themselves with adopting it without qualification, and stating as briefly as possible their conclusions on the various points most strongly pressed at the Bar."

Lawyers agree that they cannot recall any instance where such very complimentary language was used by the Judicial Committee. May we extend to Sir Louis our congratulations, wishing him many happy New Years in a position he so highly adorns.

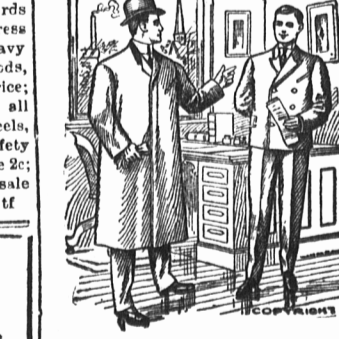
