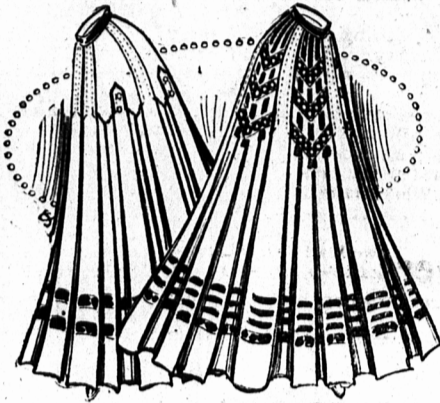

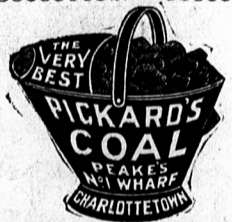

son they gave—I was to the Red Cross once. The doctor knows that I have bronchitis. On every occasion he gave me an order I told him I had bronchitis. He questioned me carefully. I don't remember getting an order on the day before the civic election I may have got one. If the certificate on the Red Cross Drugstore is for that date that is correct. Always got the orders from the doctor in his office. I always told the doctor the liquor was the only thing would clear out my tubes. I don't remember any of the dates of certificates. Can't remember going to Byrne Bros. on March 14. Suppose I did. On March 28 got a bottle of Jamaica spirits. I told the doctor then I would like the order for Jamaica spirits. I remember getting an order for a put don't remember it was April 2. I suppose I got an order on Byrne Bros. for 4th April if order is on them. I paid 50c a piece for the orders.
To Mr. Weeks—I got seven certificates between Jan. 14 and April 8, from Dr. McNeill. I told the doctor I was suffering from a bad cough and influenza, and wanted some stimulants to cure and ease me. The doctor prescribed this for me for medical purposes and cautioned me to use them that way. The doctor has given me medicine in his own office. The doctor did not give me the prescription on Jan. 26 for anything but my bronchitis. I have suffered from a weak heart. I remember telling the doctor that. I always have a bronchial cough it was for that the doctor prescribed. I swear positively he did not prescribe for any other purpose. I got it for medical purposes on March 24. On the 2nd and 4th April too, it was for the same purpose. The doctor never gave me these as a matter of course he always cautioned me how to use it.
George McDonald was called to the stand and said entry in his book Jan. 26 of delivery to John Hogan (for which the certificate is missing). Mr. Weeks objected and the witness was instructed to produce his book. The book was brought into court and Mr. McDonald resumed his place on the witness stand.
To Mr. Mellish—The entries in this book are made from the certificates. There is an entry dated 24th January, filed 26th January, drawn by Dr. McNeill in favor of John Hogan.
To Mr. Weeks: I don't know when the certificates were issued. There (Continued on page eleven)

Witness—When I got the first orders he gave me no directions. When I had the grippe he directed me how to take it.
Cross-examined by Mr. Weeks—The doctor prescribed for my boy on the 14th March; the boy is always sick. I swear positively I never went to Dr. McNeill for certificates for other than medical purposes. I found the liquor did me good. I went for the liquor for that purpose—to do me good. I never got any liquor from Dr. McNeill for other than medical purposes.
To Mr. Mellish—I was never refused liquor at any place.
John Donovan (Sworn and examined by Mr. Mellish.) I remember getting a certificate April 8 on the Two Macs from Dr. McNeill. The Two Macs refused to fill it. I went back to the Dr. and he changed it to A. W. Reddin. I had a little in me that day perhaps that is the reason they refused me.
Mr. Weeks interrupted and was told by His Honor that the interruptions would have to cease. On the 5th April I got an order—it was Sunday. I told the doctor I had the grippe. I met the doctor in Reddin's and told him I had the grippe. He examined me in back. He put a thermometer in my mouth. The two clerks were there. He then wrote me out the order. When I went to him on the 8th it was in the evening. I found him in his office. I told him I wanted another order I had the grippe and wanted to get a sweat. He gave me an order for 12 oz. and another order for medicine. I did not fill the order for medicine then. I lay out to fill it, I did not have enough to fill it then; I filled the order for the liquor.
To Mr. Weeks—On the 5th of April when I met the doctor in Reddin's I was sick I had been suffering from the grippe right along. After the doctor examined me he gave me the prescription for medical purposes. The doctor examined me before he gave me certificate.
To Mr. Mellish—It was at A. W. Reddin's.
Thomas Donovan, Sr.—Am a tobaccoist. On Jan. 18 I might have got an order from Dr. McNeill; I don't know anything about my son.
Mr. Weeks objected to Mr. Mellish asking witness questions about his son.
Mr. Mellish said he was trying to locate the date.
Witness—I don't remember going to Byrne Bros. for 12 oz. and being refused. I remember going to A. W. Reddin's and getting an order filled. When I went to Byrne Bros. and was refused I took the order back to Dr. McNeill and I think he changed it. I don't remember distinctly. I don't remember the date. I forget why Byrne Bros. refused. I forget which of them refused. I forget what rea-
