A GREAT WORK ACCOMPLISHED. NEW YORK, May 15-That it is necessary to place in institutions most of the boys who have been induced to forsake the Bowery in order that they cannot be approached by thieves aiming to teach them to lead a life of crime was the assertion made yesterday by Thomas J. Noonan, superintendent of the Midnight Mission at No. 5 Doyers Street, conducted by the Rescue Society. In a report issued by the Society he says:

"Scores of boys with various experiences, some who run away from home, wanting to see the sights of a great city, especially the Bowery and Chinatown, and who would eventually be drawn into the whirlpool of sin and misery, have drifted into our institution where they could be taken care of until able to reach their homes or procure employment, instead of eventually becoming inmates of the Tombs. Sad to relate, we know by experience that scattered throughout the lower section of our city there are modern Fagins and twentieth century Bill Sykes ever on the alert, seeking candidates for their kindergarten in the school of crime."

In commenting on his statement, Mr. Noonan declared that thieves were flocking into the city in large numbers. He has spent the last ten years studying conditions in the Bowery and Chinatown. "The going is good in New York" is the password that has gone out to the criminals in Chicago, Boston and other large cities," said the Noonan. "Thieves never operated so

"Sixty-nine boys were taken from the Bowery in the last three months by our society. The majority of the boys were under eighteen years of age. We do not dare to send the boys to lodging houses because there is danger that they will fall into the hands of the members of a band of thieves who spend much of their time in Chinatown. It is the practice of the members of this band to teach boys to steal."

THIS YEAR'S CAMPING.

ST. JOHN, May 17-Officers of the local militia have received orders which countermand those issued from headquarters some weeks ago to the effect that there would be two camps at Sussex this year. The new orders call for only one camp, and there is no doubt that from present arrangements, the gathering will be the largest in the history of military circles in the maritime provinces, as there will be about 3,300 men under arms. This number is much greater than in other years. The first orders issued indicated that the custom established last year namely the holding of two camps extending for about a month with three or four days intervening, would be adhered to this summer, but now that these have been countermanded the rural regiments and corps are preparing to enter camp in one assembly from June 21 to July 7, a period of sixteen days. The regiments taking the annual drill this year at Sussex will include one from Prince Edward Island, the P. E. I. Light Cavalry brigade, which will take their drilling there for the first time. The others will be the Princess Louise Hussars and the 28th N. B. Dragoons, which compose the balance of the mounted brigade of the 13th infantry brigade, Army service Corps, Army Medical Corps, Signalling Corps, Engineers and Corps of Guides. Contracts have already been entered into for some of the supplies.

FESTIVAL AT MT. ALLISON.

SACKVILLE, N. B., May 17-Everyone is looking forward with keen interest to the Mount Allison Musical Festival to be held in the Charles Fawcett Memorial hall Thursday and Friday evenings and Friday afternoon of next week. Messrs. Jan and Boris Hamberg, of Toronto, the celebrated musicians are the chief attraction and inasmuch as this is their first visit to the Maritime Provinces their coming is arousing a great deal of interest. Jan Hamberg, violin virtuoso, who is the second son of Prof. Mark Hamberg, was the favorite pupil in turn of Wilhelm Sauret, Heerman and Ysaye and he combines in his playing the greatest qualities of these world-renowned masters. He has played concert engagements with conspicuous success in Europe, Australia, South Africa, Canada and the United States. Boris Hamberg, cello virtuoso, was trained under Prof. Hugo Becker of Frankfurt. His London debut was made in 1904 and his Berlin debut in 1905. His career has been an unbroken series of successes. He has played in all the big musical centres of Europe, Australia, New Zealand, South Africa and the United States. MAN'S RASH ACT.

ST. JOHN, May 17-William McKenzie, a fireman on board of the Government steamer Lansdowne, was taken to the hospital on the arrival of the steamer tonight with his throat fearfully gashed as the result of an attempt to end his life, on Thursday night, while the boat was at anchor at Beaver Harbor, and that the man is alive is only due to the hard drive of two doctors from St. George, many miles away, who made the journey in a pouring rain. McKenzie is of splendid physique, and was in his usual good spirits up till Thursday when he gave signs of unbalanced mind. He complained to the officers that there was a plan afoot to throw him overboard, and expressed fear to return to the fo'castle. It was deemed wise under the circumstances to put the man in the engineer's room. Soon after the crew were horrified to find the man terribly injured. He had broken the glass of a small picture and frightfully gashed his throat.
