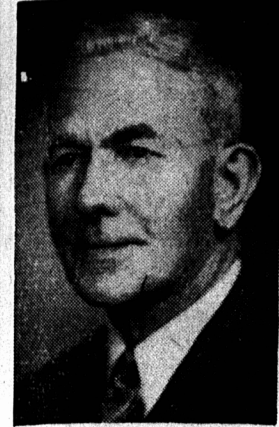


To Attend Conference

SUMMERSIDE POLICE COURT

The following report of the Summerside Police Dept. was read at the Town Council meeting Monday night: Drunkenness: Arrests 9; convictions 9. Consuming: Arrests 1; convictions 1. Theft: Cases 9; convictions 8. Fines and costs, collected, \$39.00. I wish to state that of the eighteen cases before E. H. Strong, Stipendiary Magistrate, for his disposal, twelve were committed to jail, which accounts for the small amount collected for fines during the month. On Feb. 25th, checked the Town Abattoir and found 13 carcasses of beef, 2 veal, 11 pork. Visited all meat shops. Found 2 carcasses of pork and two different shops which had not been inspected; also two hind-quarters of beef at another. Three charges were laid and three different parties were fined. I may say that a lot of the meat now sold in Summerside is coming from the Canada Packers. I may also say that the meat vendors now are being visited two or more times a week and a close check is being kept on the abattoir at all times.—S.

Bills Of Interest To S'ide In Committee

Summerside figured prominently in the affairs of the Provincial Legislature yesterday when an Act to further amend "The Summerside Incorporation Act, 1903" was agreed to in principle in committee and given its second reading.

C. W. Delaney (5th Prince) promoted this bill to empower the town of Summerside to borrow an additional \$100,000 for permanent work on the town streets. In discussion of a bill to amend the act respecting Public Schools, Premier J. Walter Jones read a lengthy letter from the chairman of the School Board in Summerside protesting any action by which taxes paid by non-residents of the city could be credited towards tuition fees charged for the non-residents' children.

Lorne H. MacFarlane (5th Prince) moved the following amendment to the bill: Subsection 3 of Section 116 of the said Act as enacted by Section 14 of the Act 11 George VI Chapter 32 is hereby amended by adding at the end thereof the following: "Provided that the amount of any taxes paid by such non-resident ratepayer to such city or town shall be deemed a credit against such additional tuition fees."

Progress was reported on the bill which was held over for further consideration.

KELLY'S CROSS C. W. L. The monthly meeting of St. Joseph's sub-division was held on Sunday, March 6th, and despite the poor condition of the roads there was a good attendance. The president opened the meeting with the League Prayer, and the secretary read the minutes of the 5th meeting.

Correspondence was read and the treasurer then gave a very satisfactory report, a nice sum being realized from the series of card parties held in the Parish Hall.

Entertainment committees were then heard from and a discussion followed this on some form of entertainment for St. Patrick's. It was decided to donate \$5.00 each to Sisters of St. Martha and C.W.L. scholarships. The meeting was then adjourned.

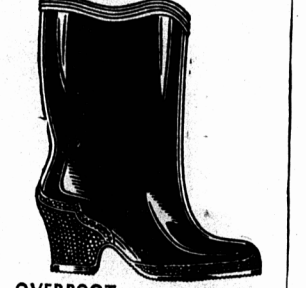

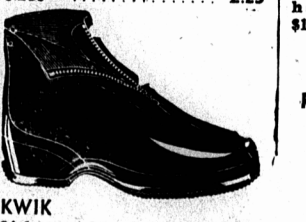

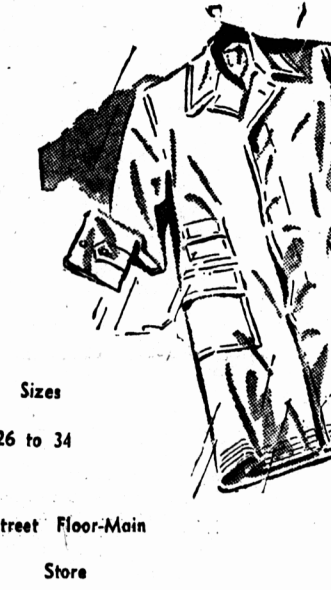
