**THE FIRE AT NEW HAVEN**—The chemical engine of the Charlottetown Fire Department in response to the call for aid to help extinguish the heavy bush fire made the run from the city to New Haven in 52 minutes. The engine was in charge of Mr. Harry Mathieson. Its services however were not required, the farmers of the district by strenuous efforts having headed the blaze, preventing it from reaching the houses which were threatened. The engine only met one bad piece of road on the trip. On one part of the journey an obstacle was encountered in the shape of a log lying across the road, evidently placed here by some rabid anti-auto fiend. The firemen in the auto which accompanied the engine saw it in time and removed it thus preventing what might have been a very bad accident.  
**KINDNESS APPRECIATED**—Last week the twenty-two men at the drill were surprised and gladdened when after enduring the monotony and confinement of quarantine for upwards of a week they received dainty boxes of luncheon consisting of sandwiches and cake neatly packed and bonated by the Ladies Auxiliary of the Army and Navy Veterans Association. The ladies are to be commended for their untiring and praiseworthy work on behalf of all our boys in khaki, including both returned soldiers and recruits. The Ladies Auxiliary of the Army and Navy Veterans Associations now number 170 members, all eager to help and serve the soldiers. They have organized a committee for visiting sick soldiers in the hospitals and their homes and interest themselves in the families of all overseas men. The Auxiliary state they will gladly receive the names of any wives or families to whom they could be of service, as it is not only their aim to supply the soldiers with comforts of which they are necessarily deprived when away from home, but also to try and compensate in some measure the family for the absence of their boy in khaki.
