LESS IMMIGRATION THIS YEAR.

Several causes will tend to limit the influx of immigrants to Canada this year below that of 1907.

Beyond question these are wholesome warnings and restrictions. Not a few of those who came last year have become a charge upon the western cities.

Here are a few hints issued by the Colonial Office which are full of significance for that class of emigrants who are ignorant and disposed to be patronising:

"It is no use for you to go to Canada unless you try to adapt yourself to local conditions and respect local feeling."

"Every country has its own methods of work, and in Canada you will often find the arrangement of the workshop or the farm, and the tools you will use, different from those at home."

"Do not above all things try to impress on your Canadian employer how much better we do things in England, for it will only make him dislike you and perhaps not care to keep you in his employ."

"You must be prepared to work hard, and often for longer hours than in the United Kingdom. There is no leisure class in Canada, but everyone is a worker."

This is wholesome advice, which may tend to check immigration, but mainly that of the undesirable classes. The tide has set so strongly toward Canada that despite these hints and checks we shall still have as many immigrants coming as we can assimilate year by year.

It is good to read in the Fisheries Report for 1907 that the Island fisheries yielded a value of \$1,168,939, an increase over the previous year of \$170,017.

Manitoba farmers object to the unrestricted movements of the automobiles out there and one member of the legislature has introduced a bill imposing severe restrictions as to speed, requiring all chauffeurs to be registered, numbered, certified and so on.

THE ASIATIC INVASION.

For a quarter of a century British Columbia has complained of the Asiatic invasion. First it was the Chinese. It was sought to check this by a head tax, first of \$50, then of \$100, since raised to \$500 per head.

How many Asiatics are now in British Columbia? The Vancouver World points out that by the census of 1901 there were then 14,376 Chinese and 4,578 Japanese, nearly 18,000 in all.
