DOROTHY DIX SAYS—

Divorce Injustice

Responsibility Too Often Placed On Husband When Distaff Is To Blame

DEAR MISS DIX: When a marriage ends in divorce, unless the wife has committed some crime she gets all the sympathy and the husband all the blame. Everybody pities and "poor Marys" her. This often works a great injustice on the man. The courts should judge a broken marriage by facts and decide it on the evidence, just like they do any other case. If they found that the wife and not the husband was at fault and had never made any effort to make a comfortable home for her family, she should be denied any alimony. She should be made to support herself. It would make many a woman get busy if she knew that she couldn't make a racket out of being a parasite on her husband.

ANOTHER METHOD OF TREATMENT FOR ASTHMATIC ATTACKS

It is only within the last 20 years that physicians have learned about the "white ones" and various substances as foods, furs, feathers, pollen from plants. By scratching the skin and putting some of the suspected substance into the scratch, the physician learns—by the skin reaction — what is causing the asthmatic attacks and is able to stop the attacks in most cases. In other cases of asthma, defects of nose and sinuses are the cause and the correction of these defects bring relief. Still other cases are caused by smoke, irritating gases, fatigue and emotional disturbances. Fortunately, there are no symptoms of any kind between attacks. Naturally, during an attack, the patient's only interest is to obtain

Cook's Corner

DELICIOUS CARROT CASSEOLE

To the color which the carrots impart to this dish is added the warm tone of the ketchup.
2 cups shredded raw carrot
1 cup finely diced raw celery
1 cup 1/4-inch diced stale bread
1 teaspoon salt
1/4 teaspoon pepper
2 eggs
1/4 cup milk
2 tablespoons tomato ketchup
2 tablespoons finely chopped onion
Measure prepared carrots into a large bowl and add the celery, diced bread, salt and pepper; combine lightly.
Beat eggs until thick and light and stir in the mixture and onion.
Add egg mixture to vegetable mixture and mix lightly.
Turn into a greased casserole.
Cover and bake in a moderate oven, 350 degrees, until vegetables are tender — about one hour.
