The case of Dr. Gallant against Dr. McKenna, both of Oyster Bed Bridge was concluded last evening before the Supreme Court and resulted in a verdict for the plaintiff for fifty dollars damages. When the Court met yesterday morning Mr. Justice Fitzgerald refused the motion for a nonsuit which had been applied for by W. S. Stewart, K. C. and argued on the previous evening, and directed the case to proceed, reserving the question of nonsuit for further argument. A. A. McLean, K. C., on behalf of the defendant opened the case for the defence and proceeded to call the defendant witnesses, the examination of which occupied the attention of the court until the afternoon. At the conclusion of this examination of the defendant's witnesses, Mr. Stewart, K. C., giving his closing address on behalf of the defendant, Mr. Gaudet replied on behalf of the plaintiff, after which Mr. Justice Fitzgerald charged the jury and submitted certain questions for their consideration. The jury retired and upon their return to the court room announced that they had found a verdict for the plaintiff and fixed his damages at fifty dollars. 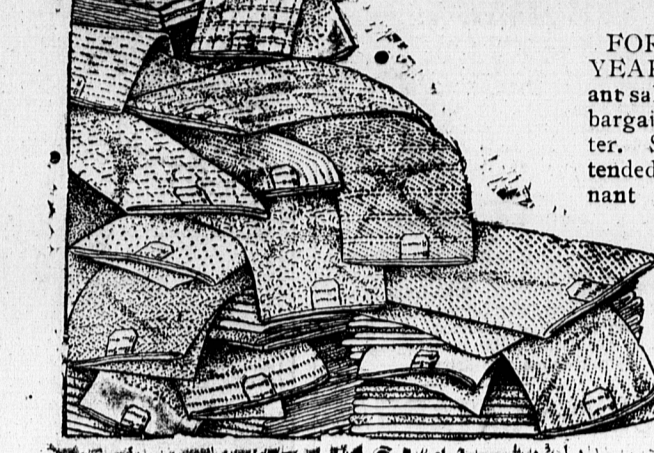
