Benjamin Franklin has left on record the feelings with which he donned his first long-tailed blue coat, and how he walked along by the sunny side of the wall that he might see the shadow of himself as thus adorned. He felt "tall and strong and dignified." Some such feeling has come over Sydney town and the Record rises to give it exultant expression. "The daily newspaper, the concrete sidewalk and the colored boot-black—three new evidences of Sydney's claims to metropolitan honors—have been added within the past few weeks." Let the Sydney boot-black arise and shine.

The report is current that the Czar has expressed to his intimate counsellors a desire to abdicate in favor of his brother. His Majesty is said to have become utterly disheartened at the internal condition of his country. He has neither the will power nor the physical strength to contend with the situation and with the opposing retrogressive aristocracy by which he is surrounded. The Czarina's accouchements is expected next month, and, if she does not present the Czar with a prince, his decisions to abdicate will probably become irrevocable.

The close division of parties in Ontario has led to some speculation as to whether another appeal to the people may not soon be made. It would, however, be quite beyond precedent to bring on another general election before the Legislature has been called together. The Legislature must be organized before it can be dissolved. Goldwin Smith has accordingly advised that the Legislature be promptly called together that the two parties may have a trial of strength. He holds it to be unfair to the Judges to make them try election petitions when parties are so evenly divided, as in such circumstances a Judge may have to decide not only who is entitled to a particular seat, but also to practically decide which of the two parties shall control the Government of the Province.

The Toronto Globe a few days ago pointed out that the rate on butter from Montreal to Liverpool was 27s 6d, while from New York or Boston the rate to Liverpool was 20s. This difference of 7s 6d against Montreal was actually much greater in the corresponding week of last year when the rate from Montreal was 25s and from New York and Boston but 11s 3d. The same excess of freight rates from Montreal as compared with leading American ports applied to cheese, eggs and other articles of Canadian produce. This condition of things is a serious handicap to the Canadian producer, who has to compete with American produce in the British market. It has been used as a reason why Canada needs her own Atlantic line. At this distance the facts seem to show that Montreal is not well situated to be the terminal of the Atlantic service. The St. Lawrence route is distinctly out of favor with ship-owners and marine underwriters.
