Synopsis of Canadian North-west Land Regulations.

ANY person who is the sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years of age, may become a homesteader in the Northwest Territories or Alberta. The applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Land Agency or sub-Agency for the district. Entry by proxy may be made at the Agency, on certain conditions, by father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of intending homesteader.

Notice.—Six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land, each of three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 80 acres solely owned and occupied by him or by his father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister.

In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter-section along side his homestead. Price \$3.00 per acre. Duties must reside six months in each of six years from date of homestead entry (including the time required to earn homestead patent) and cultivate acre extra.

A homesteader who has exhausted his home-credit right cannot obtain a pre-emption privilege. Price \$3.00 per acre. Duties must reside six months in each of six years from date fifty acres and erect a house worth \$3000.00.
