**ROYAL FAMILY WILL TRAVEL ON NEW SHIP**

Britain's newest battleship, the 45,000-ton Vanguard, has been chosen to take the King, the Queen and their daughters, Princess Elizabeth and Princess Margaret Rose, to South Africa, next year.

The warship was launched secretly by Princess Elizabeth at the Clydebank, in December, 1944, the first ship she had launched. On Sunday, May 12, she will go to Greenock, Scotland, to attend the ship commissioning service and dedication of the chapel.

The Admiralty announced the first captain of the Vanguard will

be Capt. W. G. Agnew, who in 1940 commanded the cruiser Aurora in several engagements in the Mediterranean against the Italians.

**\$20,000 DRESS WORN BY QUEEN SENT FROM OTTAWA TO TORONTO MUSEUM**

Q. How can I make a good household glue?

## Cook's Corner

### MARBLE OUP CAKES

2 tablespoons sugar  
2 tablespoons water  
1 square (1 oz.) unsweetened chocolate  
¼ teaspoon salt  
1 1/3 cups sifted cake or pastry flour  
1 teaspoon vanilla  
2½ teaspoons baking powder  
¼ cup butter or shortening  
¼ cup sugar  
2 egg whites, unbeaten  
½ cup milk

METHOD: Combine the sugar, water and chocolate, that is, the first three ingredients, in a saucepan and cook over low heat, until thick and smooth, stirring constantly. Stir in the soda and cool slightly.

Sift the cake or pastry flour once, then measure and sift again with the salt and baking powder. Cream the butter or shortening thoroughly, add the ¼ cup sugar gradually, and cream together until light and fluffy. Add the egg whites, one at a time, beating very thoroughly after each addition until smooth. Add the dry ingredients alternately with the milk, a small amount of each at a time, beating after each addition until smooth again.

Divide the batter into two parts. To one part add the chocolate mixture, stirring until blended. Place by teaspoons in greased-cup cake pans or paper cups, alternating light and dark mixtures. Don't fill the pans or cups any more than two-thirds full. Bake in a moderate oven (375 deg. F.) for 25 minutes, or until done. Remove from pans and cool, when baked, then ice with a chocolate frosting.
