The ocean tug F. W. Roebing, Captain Rudolph, leaves this morning for D. City. She will there take the government dredge George McKenzie in tow around Nova Scotia to Cape Tormentine.—Halifax Herald.

GOVERNOR Ross of the Yukon is seriously ill. It will be remembered that Mrs. Ross nee Miss McKay was drowned about a year ago in a steamboat accident. Deceased lady belonged to this province.

An ice cream and strawberry festival under the auspices of the Ladies Aid Society of the Central Christian Church, will be held on the beautiful grounds of "Newlands" the residence of Alfred Dewar, Esq., on Thursday next at 4 o'clock and continuing on into the evening. The Charlottetown correspondent of the Homestead in referring to butter and cheese says:—"Dairy butter sells at 13c, creamery at 21c. The supply of dairy butter has been large for weeks but a decline is looked for by dealers. The creameries are having a satisfactory output. The season of late has been good for pasture. Cheese is quoted at 9c. Very little has been exported this season. It is a noticeable fact that the demand for a large supply of milk grows great every day. Our numerous butter and cheese factories could make profitable use of double quantity of milk they are at present receiving. Butter especially is now called for in immense quantities; and our province is unable to fill the orders which continue to come from various foreign markets. The prospect for a speedy sale of cheese are quite encouraging. In addition to this the factory for preparing condensed milk at Charlottetown needs ten times the amount of milk it usually receives, and it offers satisfactory prices to those who supply first class material. Many farmers are regretting a failure in their corn crops but this is balanced by promise of an abundant rye crop.

Mr. M. J. O'Brien, a railroad contractor, has signed a contract to build a line of railway from Middleton, in the county of Annapolis, to Victoria Beach, a distance of forty-five miles. The line, which runs through Western Nova Scotia, will probably be completed next year. This is what Mr. O'Brien said when he was at Montreal Saturday; but he adds that before construction is far advanced the fusion of several railway interests will have taken place, and a new trunk line from eastern to western Nova Scotia will be involved. It is reported that the Midland will be extended from Windsor to Middleton, forty miles, this link passing through the Gaspereaux Valley, one of the most fruitful parts of that rich agricultural province. This would give a through railway from Truro to Windsor, sixty miles; Windsor to Middleton, forty miles, and from Middleton to Victoria Beach, forty-five miles, making a total of 145 miles, connecting central Nova Scotia with Victoria Beach, which is a first class harbor, thence by a fast steamer to the American coast. The promoters of this new amalgamation maintain that it would give them the most direct and popular route to the western centre of Nova Scotia and a good connection with the New England Cities. It is also thought probable that the combination of railway interests will secure a further extension eastward by the Strait of Canso, thus tapping the growing passenger business of the Island of Cape Breton.
