At horse races held recently in Sydney, N. S. there was present over 2,000 from all parts of Cape Breton. The early part of the afternoon was fine, but rain marred the races during the latter part of the day. In the minute class, Helen Rowland, owned by J. C. Peters, won first, and Queen Banitt Wm. Hall Waterford, second. In the 2.40 class Grace Mac, owned by R. J. King, Sydney Mines, and formerly owned in Charlottetown was first and Oak Hall, Steve Purvis, second. In the Free-for-All, Dan McKay's Spooney Boy took first and Walter J. Jed Martin, Sydney, second.

The first instructions given to Hon. A. B. Morine as head of the Public Service Commission was to make a thorough investigation of all the public contracts which the Marine Department had made during the past ten years, and especially those where the work was still going on. Her husband predeceased her forty years, and her last two sons who have gone to their eternal reward, two had four years.
