The Rural Community.

Select your community carefully. Study its past, make sure you want to share its present, believe in its future and be one to make it the best in Canada. The people make the community. Are they friendly, genial, energetic, enthusiastic? Is the community prosperous and progressive?

The Farm.

It is your job to know the kind of farm you want and to seek it diligently until you find it. Every farm is home to the children. Will it produce profits and still be homelike? Search and accept only a good deed and land free from boundary disputes. Look for fertile land. Specialists may farm unfruitful soils and produce profits but the average man should avoid them.

CHICAGO WOMAN LOSES IN FIGHT FOR "BABY IRENE"; STATE DUTY TO PROVIDE.

TORONTO, Dec. 10.—Margaret Ryan, a Carleton county girl, is declared the mother of the famous "Baby Irene" in a judgment handed down yesterday afternoon by Mr. Justice Lennox. At the same time the judge

directed that the baby be not removed from the jurisdiction of the Ontario courts until the time has elapsed for the appeal of the case, and then not until further orders.

OTTAWA, Dec. 10.—Mrs. Dolly Ledgerwood Matters is the widow of the late Frederick Matters, a Chicago contractor, who left a fortune of upwards of a quarter of a million dollars. Matters came to Ottawa in June of the same year and returning to Chicago, claiming to have given birth to the female child she brought home with her. As Matters had died without leaving a will, she sought administration of the estate on behalf of herself and child as the sole heirs. Relatives of the dead man contested the claim, bringing up the question of the motherhood of the child and claiming Mrs. Matters was only entitled to the widow's share under the laws of the state. A charge of conspiracy was laid against Mrs. Matters in the Chicago criminal courts and after a lengthy hearing Mrs. Matters was acquitted. Then Margaret Ryan of Ottawa appeared on the scene and was successful in claiming possession of the child under a writ of habeas corpus in the court of Federal Judge Landis, and brought the child to Ottawa. Mrs. Matters later appealed Judge Landis' decision and the United States court of appeal decided in her favor. However, the child was outside the jurisdiction of the United States courts and the Ryan girl refused to give it up.

Then followed Mrs. Matter's sensational attempt at kidnapping of this summer, the laying of a charge still pending of attempted kidnapping and her subsequent institution of the habeas corpus proceeding in the supreme court of the province of Ontario, just concluded by the judgment of Justice Lennox.
