Visit Charlottetown On 50,000 Mile Tour

Noteworthy visitors to Charlottetown this week are Mr. and Mrs. Herbert A. Hoyer, of Passaic-Grille Beach, Florida, who celebrated their golden wedding anniversary four years ago and are now engaged in a 50,000 mile two-year automobile tour of the United States, Canada, Mexico, the West Indies and South America.

Mr. Hoyer is eighty-one years of age. Mrs. Hoyer a few years younger. Both are in vigorous health and in the last forty-two years, before starting on their present tour, travelled a million miles by automobile, visiting practically every country in the world.

Made Motoring History

In the year 1908, the Hoyers made the first transcontinental automobile tour, from Mexico to Canada and from the Pacific to the Atlantic ocean, ever made by man and wife.
