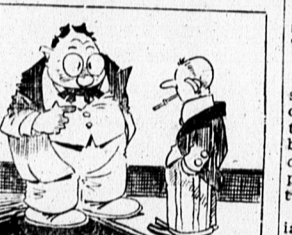

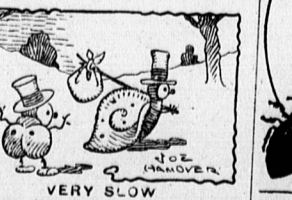

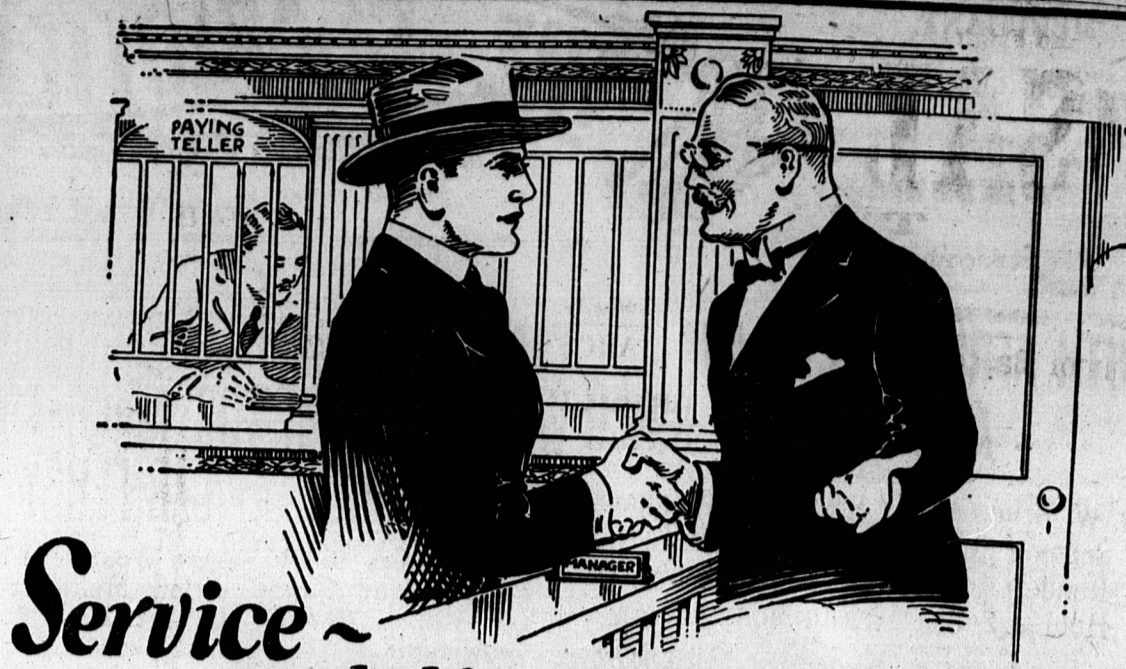
**NOW GO ON WITH THE STORY**

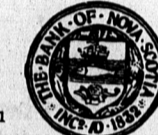
