

LONDON, Nov. 9.—The body of Sir George Williams, founder of the Y. M. C. A. and president of its London headquarters for twenty years, who died Nov. 6th, will be buried in St. Paul's Cathedral, Nov. 16th. The memorial requesting burial in St. Paul's, included the names of persons prominent in all walks of life, and was reinforced by resolutions from the Council of North America, representing 400,000 members of the Association and also by a resolution from the Council in many other countries.
