MEAT INSPECTION.

From a pamphlet recently issued by the Meat Inspection Division of the Department of Agriculture, we quote the following significant paragraph:

"The sooner the private slaughter house is abolished altogether the better for all concerned, as most of the objectionable meats piled on the market emanate from these undesirable and insanitary places.

cases under very questionable conditions. The carcasses are, also in many cases, hung in an atmosphere laden with pollution from the surroundings, inseparable from the continuous slaughter of animals where thorough drainage is out of the question.

How many meat eaters have taken the trouble to inspect for themselves the sources from which their meat is obtained? There is not a lady in the province, however efficient and reliable her help may be, who does not, occasionally at least, visit her kitchen and her pantry, where the family food is prepared.

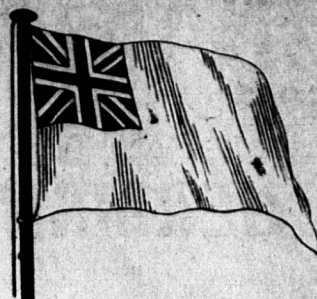

PLAGUE VISITATION DID MUCH GOOD.

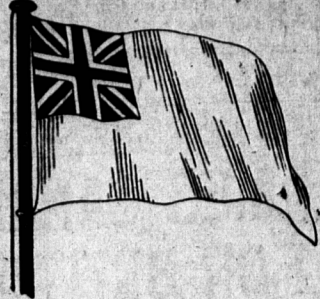

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SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH WEST LAND REGULATIONS.

ANY person who in the sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years old, may homestead a quarter section of a valuable Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. The applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-agency for the district. Entry by proxy may be made at any Agency, on certain conditions by father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of intending homesteader.
