The following are the Alberton market prices: White and black oats, thirty-six to thirty-seven cents a bus; eggs twenty-one cents a doz; butter, (eighteen cents a lb; hides, ten cents a lb; pork, nine to nine and one half cents a lb; and hay eight to nine dollars a ton. Summerside dealers, yesterday were paying twenty cents a lb for butter, twenty cents a bus for potatoes, eighteen cents a ton for loose hay and forty fifty for straw, thirty-eight to thirty-nine cents a bus for oats and twenty cents a lb for wool. There passed peacefully away, last evening, one of Summerside's oldest and most respected citizens, David Rogers, in the 80th year of his age. Mr Rogers was born at Wales, England, and came to this province with his parents in 1832. He was one of the first to start business in Summerside and carried on a large mercantile trade for many years. He always took a deep interest in the affairs of the town and was the first Mayor elected after its incorporation, which position he held for four years. He also represented Summerside and Lot 17 for four years in the local house of parliament and was ever watchful of the interests of the Province generally. Mr Rogers was twice married. His first wife was a daughter of the late James A. Gourlie, Summerside, and died 25 years ago. His second wife was Miss Rose Bryne of Nova Scotia and survives him. Hon Benj Rogers, Alberton, and Jas Rogers, Kensington, are his brothers. Mrs Wm Johnson, Long River, is his sister. He leaves two sons W. P. at Cowley, Alberta, and A. C. at Summerside, three daughters, Mrs J. D. A. McDonald, Winnipeg, Mrs Chas J. Giles, Winnipeg, Mrs Chas Heats, Portage, La Prairie. The funeral will take place from the residence of his son, A. C. Rogers, at two p. m. tomorrow, the 24th.
