1-2 to 1-2 points under leader-
ship of nickel and papers and
showed strength under the leader-
ship of Frasers and Abitibi. Royal
Bank was active at 200. Toronto
also gained ground, all three in-
dexes advancing. Fanny Farmer
closed at 24 7-8 a new high record
for the new stock. New York record

added 4 1-2 points to close at 110
7-8 up 9 points in the past two
days. Rails were particularly strong.
The market action was favorable.
