CHECKING UP

The enthusiasm regarding perfect operation usually comes with spring and early summer. After a time has passed this enthusiasm wanes. This is about the time that "the old bus" gets neglected if she is neglected at all. It is needless to state, however that the car needs greater attention now than in the spring. During this period, long trips are made, the weather is hot and energy takes a decline. Between the three, the car suffers. It is a good time now to remove the rear hub caps and see that the axle nuts are tight. Check the steering for looseness and adjust. Spring centre suspension bolts and nuts may be loose. Shackles, bolts, body bolts, etc. The front wheels should positively be adjusted now and inspected for grease. Universal joints (if not Thermoid) should be greased or oiled. Brakes might need adjustment. In fact take a whole morning or evening and get underneath. You will be surprised at the amount of work to be done.

QUESTS—Will Fuller Earth cure a slipping cone clutch and if so, how much should be put in?

ANS.—Fuller earth will temporarily assist a slipping clutch but the cure is either proper governor adjustment or new facing. Enough of the powder is used to dry up the oil on the facing. I do not, however recommend it.
