King Government Refuses, However, To Recognize Any Commitments Binding Canada To Adopt Military Sanctions.

OTTAWA, Oct. 29—Immediate steps will be taken by the Canadian government to secure "the effective application of economic sanctions against Italy," proposed by the co-ordinating committee of the League of Nations, Prime Minister Mackenzie King announced tonight.
