**THE MARKETS**

**REVIEW OF POULTRY MARKET FOR PAST WEEK.**

The Egg Markets generally are much firmer for the higher grades. Unfortunately, however, a large proportion of current receipts are frequently apparent at this season of the year, but is evidently more pronounced than usual this fall, the eggs having been held at country points with no proper means of storing. Such eggs have a very adverse effect on the consumptive demand and cause a bearish effect on all prices offered for eggs so collected. Storage eggs are now moving freely into consumption. Toronto firm, Montreal firm and unchanged. Montreal prices, October 8th.—Specials, —54 to 60 cents. Extras, —45 to 50 cents. First, —38 to 40 cents. Liverpool, Cable, October 8th, states prices are considerably higher in Great Britain, but supplies are fairly plentiful and heavy arrivals are expected. Boston prices are firm for all fancy, fresh eggs, these selling around 60 cents per dozen.

**Poultry**

There has been a decided increase in receipts of poultry and the market has consequently been weaker. The Jewish demand has not been as great as was expected. Preparations for storing are now being made by the trade. Prices at United States points have been mostly easier. Boston prices remain fairly firm, (Oct. 10th) being: Roosters, 17 cents. Fowl, 26 cents. Chickens, 24 cents.
