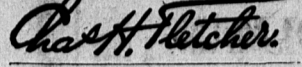

MONTREAL, July 5.—There were 102 cattle, 239 sheep and lambs, 1,425 hogs and 631 calves for sale on the two markets. Bologna hogs were sold for \$4.00 to \$4.50 and common to just medium cows from \$4.00 to \$5.00. Veal calves were from \$7.75 to \$10.00. Lambs were lower at \$10.50 to \$13.00 with the bulk at \$11.00 to \$12.00. Several lots of hogs were weighed up to packers on former contracts and the balance of the hogs were sold to butchers at \$9.75 to \$10.00 flat with 20 hogs averaging 160 pounds going at a top of \$10.75. Sows were mostly from \$6.00 to \$7.00.



That Body of Yours

MAKING LIFE WORTH WHILE

You have met the man, or perhaps the woman, with a chronic ailment. It may be rheumatism, a heart ailment, asthma, chronic bronchitis, some nerve ailment or other, and while his life is not in danger, his outlook on life is certainly not a bright one. Dr. G. R. Murray, in the Lancet, tells his brethren that these "chronics" deserve real attention, and a physician should not only encourage them to make the most of their lives, but also to give suitable advice as to the best way to accomplish this.

This means that the physician should put the ailment on one side of the balance, and after a thorough examination be able to estimate the patient's remaining powers and possibilities as accurately as possible.

Thus the condition of the parts of the body not affected by the ailment should be explained to the patient, and parts that can be strengthened by the patient's own efforts should likewise be pointed out.

Thus he will learn that there are things he should do, and things he should not do, and he will know the reasons therefor.

With this outline of his physical assets and liabilities, he can immediately engage in the business of making the best possible job of his body and of his life.

It can thus be seen that with this knowledge in his possession he can actually make his life useful. And everyone knows that when an individual thinks of his life as useful to himself, to his family, and to the world, he has really some ambition to live.

Without this idea or ideal, he is going to have a blue outlook on life. He will spend much of his time thinking of his ailment and talking about it to any one who will listen.

Of course there are many chronic invalids whose patience and brightness are an object lesson to us all, but it must be admitted that an individual with a chronic ailment gradually becomes despondent, and a care to everybody connected with him.

This idea then of having him appreciate his assets, and try to increase them, will help to take his mind off his liabilities.

In this way many a patient may be saved from drifting into an existence that is "clouded with unnecessary pessimism."
