Women Successful In Playwright World

NEW YORK, Nov. 23.—Women this season have entrenched themselves more strongly in New York playhouses, as theatrical producers, than ever before.

Invading a field which only a few years ago was monopolized by men, the outstanding feminine producers have achieved records that equal, if they do not exceed, the average records of men producers. Women head the two groups that are credited with having done most to raise the artistic standards of dramatic production.

Other members of this increasing band of women pioneers, entering into competition with men producers along the beaten track of Broadway, have shown that they possess acumen equal to that of Belasco or George M. Cohan in staging box office hits.

For financial wizardry, Anne Nichols, who produced her own play, "Abe's Irish Rose," has beaten the record of any man for money-making in the theatre. Having become a millionaire through one play, she is adding new productions.

It is in the "art" theatres, leaders in the advanced field, that women have left their greatest impress. Theresa Helburn heads the Theatre Guild as executive director. The destinies of the Neighborhood Playhouse, another torch-bearer in behalf of better drama, is in the hands of Miss Helen Arthur, with the production of "Alice and Irgaw Lewisohn," as financial backers. On a smaller scale than either of these groups, Claire Tree Major, head of the Lenox Hill group, has entered the commercial field.

Miss Eva Le Gallienne, actress, is heading one of the daring ventures of all this season. She has taken over the old Fourteenth St. Theatre, long the home of lurid melodramas, and has begun a repertory program for the production of plays by outstanding dramatists at prices far below Broadway's theatres.

Rosalie Stewart, who last year produced the Pulitzer prize play, "Craig's Wife," has expanded the scale of her productions this season. Edyth Totton, with a new theatre bearing her own name, also is in the field. Mrs. Henry B. Harris, Jr. is another woman producer in the galaxy of this season's women producers.

Sewing Trousers In French Prison

ALBERTVILLE, Savoie, France, Nov. 23.—Hopeful that his deserter's sentence of eight years in the gloom of a French military prison will be terminated before it runs its course, Bennett J. Doty of Bill, Miss., who was "Gilbert Clare" of the Foreign Legion, remains cheerful and seemingly courageous.

Two "worries" were confessed to a correspondent of The Associated Press. His fingers are too slow in sewing army trousers the "hard labor" to which he was sentenced and he's afraid the folks back home will think cowardice, instead of homesickness, prompted his flight from warfare in the arid Syrian desert.

Doty was sentenced by a French court martial at Damascus on August 16 last to the military penitentiary here for his attempt to leave French Foreign Legion when serving on the soil of an alien land. There under the name of Gilbert Clare of Memphis, Tenn., he had fought the Druse rebels in the campaign before Souaida and the mountains of the Houran.

Perched high in the Alps, in the shadow of Mont Blanc, the military penitentiary of Albertville, overlooking a beautiful valley surrounded by snow capped peaks, has a forbidding and gloomy aspect.

"Clare is a model prisoner," said Captain Besancon, commandant of the institution. "His attitude is splendid and he is a fine boy."

A little and somewhat paler, clothed in a nondescript prison uniform, long brown coat, flap cap, wooden shoes, Clare presented a sharp contrast from the proud soldier visited in the citadel at Damascus last June.

"Morale" Not Impaired

His morale is unimpaired, however, and he greeted his visitor with evident pleasure.

"Not too bad for a man who was reported 'executed' last June," he replied to a query as to his health.

"You boys better go and walk in the sun," said the Alpine Chasseur a little "Blue Devil" with fixed bayonet, patrolling the inner court. Within high walls and in a narrow strip of sunshine, the American Legionary and the correspondent walked back and forth for an hour, while the sentry studiously looked the other way.

Clare relished an American cigarette.

"Yes I get plenty to eat," he said. "A big bowl of soup in the morning; a piece of meat, one pound of bread and a plate of vegetables at noon; another quart of soup at night. It isn't the Ritz hotel but I can't kick. It might have been daisies by the roots!"

Makes Three Pair a Day

"What about the hard labor?" he was asked.

Clare laughed outright. "Hard labor! Hard labor!" he repeated. "Do you know what I do? I am sewing trousers for the army. Some 'midnight' I never did my own sewing when I was in the Legion, simply couldn't handle a needle. And now I have to turn in three completed pairs of trousers a day. The best I can finish up is one pair and one leg and I am steadily falling behind. It worries me. The needle is harder on the fingers than the trigger of the rifle. "Gee but it feels funny to be doing woman's work." I certainly didn't expect this when I enlisted. I wanted to meet Mister Abdel-Krim. I thought they were going to send me to Morocco but they found me another war just as good."

"Was nothing, we couldn't very well run away from those birds," was all he would say of the deed that won for him the Croix de Guerre.

Captain Besancon later produced Clare's citations for valor.

Denies Was Afraid

"I hope they don't think that I ran away because I was scared," Clare said suddenly. "I don't know what came over me. We hadn't gone three hours that I knew we had pulled a boner but it was too late to turn back. Palestine certainly did look to me like the

Insect Plague Goes Back 4,000,000 Years

SALT LAKE CITY, Utah, Nov. 23.—Bees, flies, beetles, ants, dragon flies and even mosquitoes were pestering our Utah 4,000,000 years ago, the same as they are today. Prof. Earl Douglass of the University of Utah, who discovered dinosaur skeletons near Vernal a year ago, has just found fossils of insects in eocene formation in Dinosaur National Monument.

Sixty specimens of fossil plants, including leaves, stems, buds, roots, flowers and fruits were also uncovered. Usually only leaves are found, said Professor Douglass.

Big Ben Is Cracked

LONDON, Nov. 23.—Big Ben is cracked. Most all radio fans who have heard on their sets the clock strike the hours from the Westminster Tower, thought there was a flaw in the bell and this is confirmed by W. Boughton, of the Ancient College of Youths, England's oldest bellingring fraternity.

He says professional bell-ringers agree that Big Ben is so cracked "that you can stick your arm through the fracture."

Clare feels some anxiety about the disposition which will be made of him when, in conformity with Premier Poincare's program of economies, the military penitentiary here is closed December 31.

"I am worried lest I be sent to some civil prison with a lot of sneak thieves, pickpockets, burglars or hold-up men," he said. "I have committed no crime against society and I don't want to be pent up with real jailbirds."

Captain Besancon informed Clare that he would probably be sent to a military prison either at Bordeaux or Marseilles.

"I have confidence in the sense of justice of the French Ministry of War," the prisoner said. "I can hardly think they will let me rot eight years in prison. I risked my life several times for their cause and I feel sure that when this bally-hooing has subsided, they will edge me out of this quietly!"

"Soup is ready, Clare," said the little Blue Devil sauntering up. The big steel and iron gate swung noisily upon its heavy hinges and Clare disappeared into the sombre prison. Leaning his face against the bars Clare shouted as a farewell: "This is a great life, if you don't weaken."

Scenic Spots Border Spanish Trail Route

BLOXI, Miss., Nov. 22.—Established by the Spanish conquerors almost a century before the Pilgrims landed in New England, the Old Spanish Trail across the southern borderlands of the United States is now becoming favored winter tourist route, affording excellent scenic effects.

Beautiful at all times from its beginning at St. Augustine, Fla., to its western terminus at San Diego, Cal., the historic trail is in all its foliage at this season of the year. Its year-around climate with mild autumn days and cool nights make motor travel a pleasure.

Cross-Country Improving

The complete construction of this trans-continental highway is now assured and some \$62,000,000 already has been spent. Constant improvement and paving is on the program of state and federal highway officials. Millions like-wise are being spent on connecting roads.

The expeditions of the conquistadores in their search for the riches of the western coast are unfolded along the route. From St. Augustine, the oldest city in America, the highway travels across the pine tree barrens of west Florida to Old Mobile. Bloxi, founded by D'Arville in 1699 as the first capital of the Louisiana Territory, and historic Pass Christian, are points on the trail along the Mississippi Gulf Coast.

Passes Three "Cross Roads"

Following the shore of the Gulf of Mexico, the trail leads south to New Orleans, the gateway to the South, and westward across the Louisiana bayous to the Texas plains. San Antonio the cross roads of the Southwest, famous for its missions, including the immortal Alamo, is visited.

The Old Spanish Trail crosses the deserts into Arizona and runs down the valley of the Gila and Salt rivers to Yuma, the gateway to California. San Diego, the terminus of the trail, is the beginning of California just at St. Augustine is the starting point in Florida.

Construction of the highway marks the triumph of ten years of labor and engineering skill. The bridges across the Gulf coast rivers and Louisiana bayous and the engineering work in the mountain passes of the west are monuments to the skill of American engineers and road builders. A great sea wall protects the highway through Mississippi.

Find But Few Women In Bootleg Business

NEW YORK, Nov. 22.—The woman bootlegger exists mainly in fiction, in the opinion of Mrs. Mary A. Sullivan, director of the New York Police Department.

But, says Mrs. Sullivan, it's not lack of inclination or mental ability that has kept women from crowding the bootlegging field. It's rather a matter of physical ability.

Truck Loading Handicap

"A woman can't load and unload a truck of liquor and that is the game, unless you are among the highups," she said.

Mrs. Sullivan, with a record of fifteen years' service in the police department, asserted that of the thousands of "speakeasies" in New York City, she does not know one that is being operated by a woman.

Records of prohibition arrests kept by the New York branch of the Anti-Saloon League reveal only nine women bootleggers, eight of whom, however, have records that rival any ever made by men.

Among Most "Famous"

Probably the most famous, or infamous, was Gertrude Lythgoe who specialized in smuggling liquor from the Bahamas. Before she finally was caught she had won the title of "Queen of the Bootleggers" and also that of "the Joan d'Arc of the Rum Runners."

Closely rivaling her was Mrs. Mabel Casares, Jr., wife of the son of a wealthy Argentine merchant. When arrested she was said to have been the head of a rum syndicate of international proportions and the owner of several vessels.

None On Rum Fleet

Two of the lesser satellites were Frances Canistraci, a 24-year-old miss, reputed to have been drawing a daily income of \$1,000 to \$2,800 from her bootlegging operations, and Helen Smith said to have been an agent for a British rum syndicate.

The ninth woman gave the judge no good reasons and escaped with a reprimand. She said she turned bootlegger to support her invalid husband and eight children.

As for women bootleggers on the rum fleet of the Atlantic coast, Captain George C. Carmine, division commander of the New York Coast Guard, who says he knows all and sees all that happens on the smuggling line asserted he never yet has seen a woman bootlegger.

French Girl Golfers

PARIS, Nov. 22.—Napoleon, the first and great one, will have the most pretentious French film to date, dealing with the career of "The Man of Destiny," will be shown at that famous playhouse.

"Napoleon" cost 12,000,000 francs to make, and no less than 4,000 French soldiers and sailors now on active service took part in the film. The scene of the big review, with the "Little Corporal" passing before his army on horseback, based on the famous paintings by Meissonier, is said to be one of the most impressive features of the production.

For one of the episodes of "Napoleon," the port of Toulon was literally set back over a hundred years in history, in order that the famous siege might be recreated.

Dampness Not Cold Is Alaska Fruit Problem

ANCHORAGE, Alaska Nov. 23.—From the standpoint of Alaska fruit growers, the old saw reads: It isn't the cold, it's the dampness.

That is the conclusion of H. W. Alberts, director of demonstration farms for Alaska.

"The only thing standing in the way of successful apple growing," he says, "is securing a region where the moisture conditions will permit the trees to harden. The cold is no barrier, but owing to the rapid growth during the long summer days, the wood does not have opportunity to harden, and absorbing an excess of moisture, is subject to freezing."

"We expect to overcome this by a new stock and make apples and cherries part of Alaska's products."
