A MOUNT Allison correspondent writing to the St. John Globe says:—"Prior to the melancholy accident of last Saturday night in which Luther Estabrooks was ran over and killed by a train on the N. B. and P. E. Island railway, two lives only have been similarly lost on this line—and of a boy named Towse. In no one of these three cases did the slightest blame attach to anyone connected with the railway. This line, which runs between Sackville and Cape Tormentine covers a distance of thirty-six miles, has been running now for about seventeen years. There is no better managed line in the Dominion. It maintains its track in first-class condition, keeps up its rolling stock, and year by year faithfully pays bondholders their stipulated interest. Not the least agreeable feature connected with its operations is, as we have seen, the infrequency of fatal accidents. It must have been this line of railway that Charles Francis Adams had in mind when he declared that the safest place in which a man could be was a railway car going at full speed. Not that there is anything precipitate about the rate of speed maintained by the "Flying Josiah", as our Cape train is jocosely called. She covers the thirty six miles in precisely two hours and twenty-four minutes; just a mile in four minutes; that is fifteen miles an hour, stoppages, however, not being allowed for. The manager, Fred Harris, who is a universal genius has invented a snow plow which he claims to be the ne plus ultra of all snow ploughs, ancient or modern. Up the front of this plough, which is trough shaped, the snow is supposed to be driven till, reaching the top, it is shot off into circumjacent space where it lapses, so to speak, into "innocuous desuetude."
