Urge Equality Of Educational Opportunity

(By The Canadian Press) SASKATOON, Aug. 29.—The Canadian Federation of Home and School will petition the Federal Government to refrain from granting to any set of group any consideration whereby the children of any such set or group are deprived of the opportunity of acquiring an education comparable to that offered in the public schools of the province in which the set or group reside. A resolution to this effect was passed at the annual convention of the Federation here today. It urged that "certain sets or groups in various parts of Canada are not only hindering but depriving their children of the opportunity of education."

NEW RUBBER SOURCE

NEW DELHI.—(CP)—A plant which might prove of considerable importance as a source of rubber in India was recently discovered by Dr. L.E. Kaul, Professor of Botany in the Meerut College. Preliminary experiments have revealed that the plant, which grows wild as a winter weed in Meerut and other parts of India, might yield as much rubber as any other tropical tree known as a source of rubber.
