CANADIAN HONORED.—The Florence Nightingale Medal has been awarded by the International Committee of the Red Cross to Miss Margaret Clotilde MacDonald, Matron in Chief of the Canadian Expeditionary Force during the war. This decoration is international in character and is awarded only to women whose work in the cause of humanity has been of paramount importance.

THE TOURIST TRADE.—A St. John's exchange says: The heavy tide of tourist traffic which for the last two months has poured into the maritime provinces has abated and now great numbers are returning to the United States. While the passenger traffic from across the border has very much decreased, there was a comparatively small number of tourists on the Boston train which arrived Saturday, but Saturday the railway officials will find it necessary to put seven or eight sleepers on the outward Boston train to take care of the traffic and they expect they will be obliged to greatly increase the accommodation on this train for the next few weeks. The Eastern Steamship Lines will also expect every heavy number on the return trips to Boston and all the staterooms on the Governor Dingley for the trip are booked. Officials of the company said yesterday that they expected that the number sailing on the Governor Dingley today would be at least double that of any previous sailing from here this season. Most of the tourists returning to the United States are from P.E. Island which has accommodated a very large number of visitors during the summer. An official of the Canadian Government Railways said yesterday that he thought from the number who left here for P.E. Island that the little province must have had nearly double its winter population during this summer.

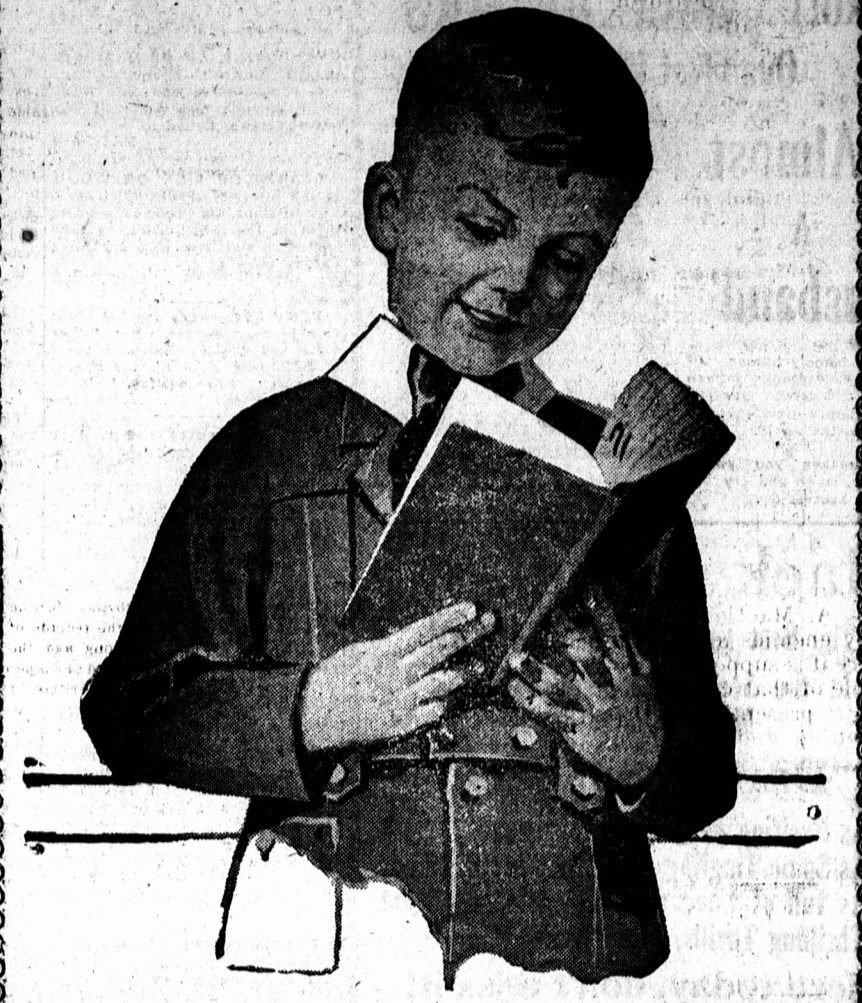
INTERESTING ANNOUNCEMENT
