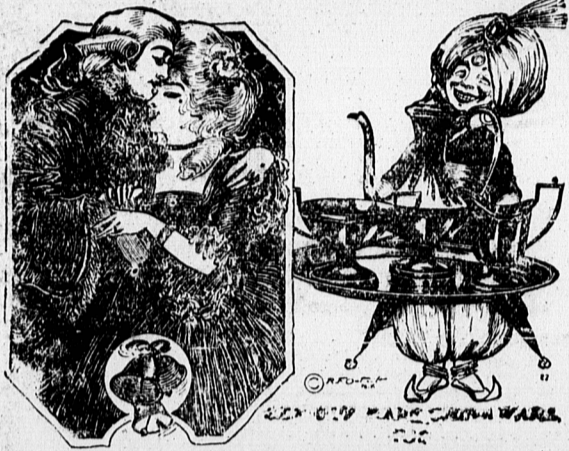

Woman Going To England On Immigration Mission

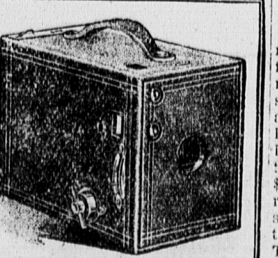
OTTAWA July 26.—Hon. Mary Ellen Smith, former member of the Government of British Columbia and at present member for Vancouver City, is in Ottawa today on route of Britain on an immigration mission. Mrs. Smith has the honor to be the first woman of the British Empire to be a member of a British Government. It will be recalled she resigned her position in order to be more truly representative of the things for which women of the country stood for. Her husband was the late Mr. Ralph Smith, one-time member of the Federal House of Commons. In commenting on her mission for the Dominion Government, Mrs. Smith stated that she was the first woman in Canada selected for this particular kind of work, and the recognition of women in the capacity of an official to bring in leading settlers to Canada ought to be some satisfaction to those interested in women's movements. Mrs. Smith will see some of the members of the Government in Ottawa, and will leave here Wednesday for Montreal, where she will stay for a day, sailing on the Montcalm. "I hope," she stated, "to be able to show intending settlers in Britain that we have a worth and wealth of opportunity in Canada to those anxious to become good Canadians."

Wave Of Mysticism In Central Europe

PARIS, July 26.—Mysticism in all its sinister moods is coming to an obsession over all Europe. A wave of mysticism is sweeping over the continent. Liberty-loving France yielding for the moment to influences begotten by psychologists to be one of the natural consequences of the war. 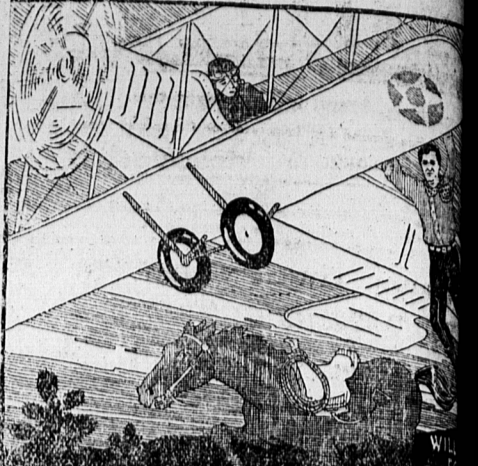

"Ah don't care for money, but certainly value my life", Irving Kendrick, colored, stated to Canadian immigration authorities recently at Sarnia, Kendrick, of Rose town, N. Y., was the proud possessor of a "roll" of \$300. A black hand gang of Detroit was hot on the trail of Irving's savings. He crossed from Detroit to Windsor on a raft to elude them. Then he dived head first through the window of a Canadian National railroad coach. After a brief ride he was forced to alight and walk into Sarnia. The immigration authorities deported him. On being questioned by the officials at Sarnia, he declared that he was attacked by colored men in Detroit, but made a successful getaway. On reaching the Canadian side, the approach of a husky colored "gen'tman" caused him to unconsciously board the train. Irving Kendrick like thousands of Canadians, knew the value of his life.
