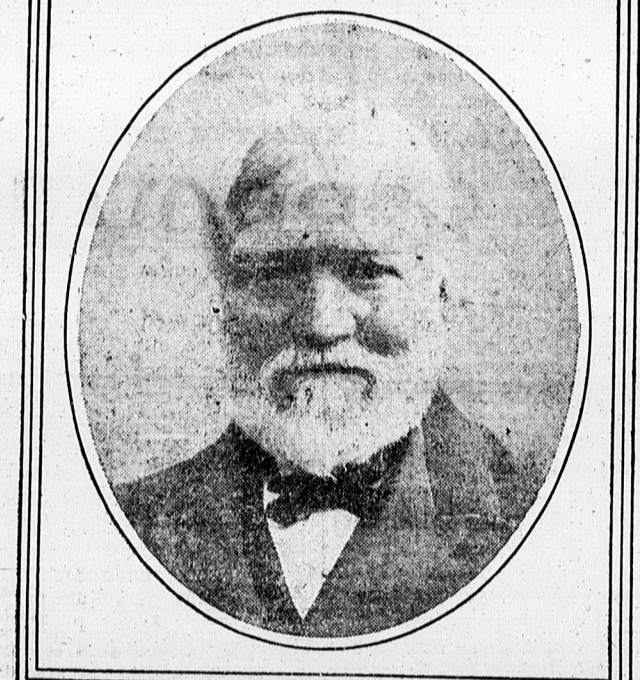

NOTED BRITISH DIPLOMAT DEAD

LOGDON, Eov. 2.—The Right Hon Sir Edmund John Monson, formerly British ambassador to France, is dead, aged 75 years.

Sir Edmund Monson had a remarkable diplomatic career, having served his country in many high positions in different parts of the world. He

became a baronet in 1905; P. C., 1893; G. C. H., created 1896; G. C. M. G., created, 1892; G. C. V. O., created, 1903; D. C. L., LL.D., M. A., was born at Chart Lodge, Kent, on October 6, 1834. He was the third son of the sixth Baron Larken, and brother of the first Viscount Oxenbridge.

In 1881 he married Eleanor Catherine Mary, daughter of Major Munro, consul-general at Montevideo, Uruguay, and had three sons. He was educated at Eton and Balliol College, Oxford, where he took first class honors in Law and History in 1855 and was made a Fellow of All Souls, Oxford, in 1858.

In 1868 he was appointed examiner for Taylorian Scholarships. He was appointed attaché at Paris in the same year, and later at Washington, also in 1858; was private secretary to the late Lord Lyons from then until 1863, when he was transferred as attaché to Hanover; was promoted to third secretary in 1863; transferred to Brussels in 1863; resigned in 1865, contested Reigate in 1865; was appointed consul in the Azores in 1869; consul-general, Hungary, in 1871; given lordship rank of second secretary H. M. Embassy at Vienna in 1874; special service in Dalmatia and Montenegro, 1876-77; C. B., 1878; minister resident and consul-general to Uruguay, 1879; envoy extraordinary and minister plenipotentiary to the Argentine Republic, and minister plenipotentiary to Paraguay, 1884; to the King of Greece, 1888; K. C. M. S., 1886; arbitrator between Denmark and the United States, Butterfield claim, 1888; en-

voy, extraordinary and minister plenipotentiary to Belgium, 1892; ambassador extraordinary and plenipotentiary to Austria, 1893; ambassador extraordinary and plenipotentiary to France 1896-1904.

He held the Cross of the Legion of Honor. His successor is his son, Maxwell William Edmund John Monson, who was born on September 21, 1882.

H. Spencer, with whom were present Messrs T. F. Fullerton, M. W. McLeod, John Murray, W. A. Mason, A. D. Sterling, R. G. Strathie, S. D. McPhee, Geo. E. Ross, A. O. Stewart, A. Cresse, W. I. Green, John Hawley, J. M. Hattie, ministers John A. Law, son, R. Munn, A. S. Nicholson, James Moar and Alex Martin, elders. Minutes of meetings held on August 3rd, Sept. 1st and 15th, Oct 6th and 28th, 1909, were read and sustained.

Messrs W. A. Mason, R. G. Sinclair, and A. J. McNeil were appointed to draft a suitable resolution in re the late Mr George McLennan.

Mr T. C. James being present, was invited to sit and correspond. An irregularity in regard to the serving of notice at Georgetown was noted, and it was agreed that Presbytery deem such reading, viz, on one Sabbath as sufficient under the circumstances.

Messrs W. A. Mason and T. C. James were appointed by the moderator to examine the session records of Covehead. Mr. Geo E. Ross called.
