-Yesterday was the hottest day experienced in Summerside for many years. The temperature at the meteorological station registered a little over 89. During the past eleven days from June 28 to July 8, the average maximum temperature has been a trifle over 82, and the average minimum temperature for the same time about 68. The lowest registered any time during this period was 60 on the 1st day of the month.

I have eleven pupils, five of whom have never been in school before. The other six are fairly well on in their studies. We have one school half hour at noon. I am well pleased with my boarding house, and do not think some districts in P. E. I. might take a lesson from the West?"

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-The school examination took place at Charlottetown June 30th. There was a large number of parents and visitors present. The pupils were examined in the various branches by their teacher Miss Sadie Gorman. All expressed their entire satisfaction at the progress made during the past year, and were greatly pleased to learn that Miss Gorman had decided to stay another year. She is an energetic painstaking teacher and is well liked by all the pupils.

-The marriage took place at the residence of Geo. L. Webber, Summerside at 8 o'clock last night of his eldest daughter Gertrude Sarah, to Frank Winfield Smith of Boston. The bride who was dressed in white tulle was attended by Miss Bertha Ramsey of Summerside while Edward Webber, brother of the bride, acted as best man. The ceremony was performed by Rev. Hammond Johnson of Summerside in the presence of only the immediate relatives of the contracting parties. After the ceremony a short reception was held at the home of the bride.
