**DAUGHTER OF THE PRESIDENT**

May Become Engaged to Millionaire Longworth

HE HAS RELATIVES HERE

A Devoted Suitor—The Reported Alliance Neither Confirmed Nor Denied by the Parties.

NEW YORK, Oct. 1.—Announcement of the engagement of Miss Alice Roosevelt, daughter of the President to Nicholas Longworth, a millionaire Representative in Congress from the First District of Ohio, is regarded as possible by friends of the young woman in this city and Washington. Mr. Longworth was asked about the reports of the romance yesterday in Republican headquarters, and in reply he resorted to the language of fine diplomacy, as follows:—  
"Say to the Press that if it is necessary that I shall be quoted at all I desire to be quoted as saying that I have nothing to say."  
The couple were twitted with being engaged at a dinner given by Mrs. Ogden Mills on Monday night and no direct denial of the imputation was forthcoming from either. Mr. Longworth and Miss Roosevelt sat side by side, and they were observed reading a small newspaper clipping, and a merry shout went up when it was found it hinted at an engagement of the couple. Out of the chaffing grew a request for a confirmation or denial of the reports, but all questions were parried. Before the party dispersed it was agreed that neither Miss Roosevelt nor Mr. Longworth had admitted that there was an engagement nor had they pointedly denied it.  
For more than a year the attentions of Mr. Longworth to Miss Roosevelt have been watched with kindly interest by the fashionable world of Washington. He has been frequently seen with her in public, and during her social triumphs in St. Louis a couple of months ago he was a guest at nearly all the gatherings attended by Miss Roosevelt. During the last session Mr. Longworth often entertained Miss Roosevelt with other young women of the Washington administration set at luncheon in the House restaurant. When Miss Roosevelt went to the Bennings races last spring Mr. Longworth was her escort. He was in Newport when Miss Roosevelt was there a few weeks ago and his devotion to her was the cause of much chaffing among the fashionable set there.  
Nicholas Longworth is thirty-five years old and is a member of one of the oldest and most distinguished families of Ohio. He is descended from Revolutionary stock, and inherited blocks of real estate in the heart of Cincinnati from his father and grandfather. He is ambitious politician, and is an eloquent and forceful platform speaker.
